SIMPLE PRESENT

Example 1 using the Root or Base word form.

Used with the Pronouns I, you, we, or they :

I work...

You ask...

We clean...

They camp...

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SIMPLE PRESENT - EXAMPLE 1

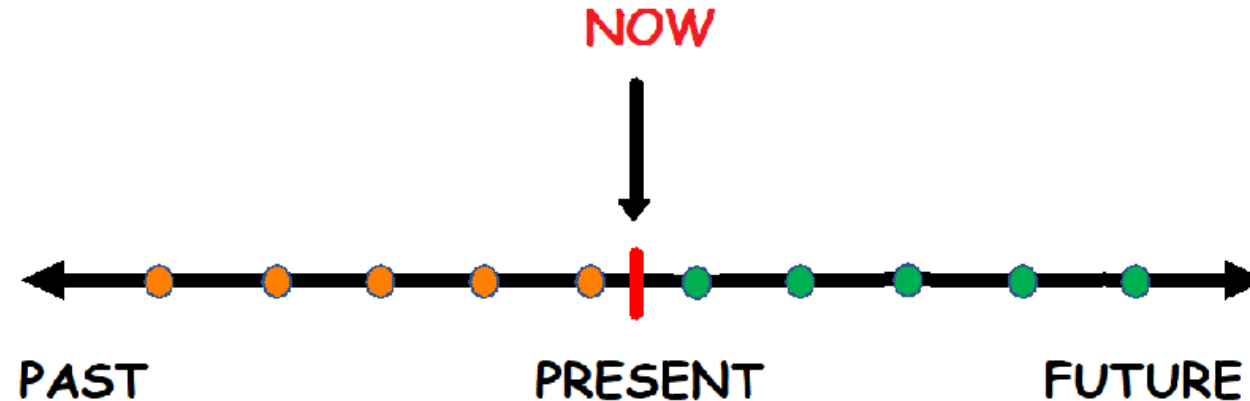
PRESENT REGULARLY SCHEDULED COMPLETED EVENTS

I work from 9 to 5 daily.

You ask good questions at every press conference.

We clean our car once a week.

They camp every weekend in the Rockies.



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SIMPLE PRESENT

Example 2 using the Root or Base word form.

Used with the Pronouns I, you, we, or they :

I work...

You relax...

We appeal...

They numb...

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SIMPLE PRESENT - EXAMPLE 2

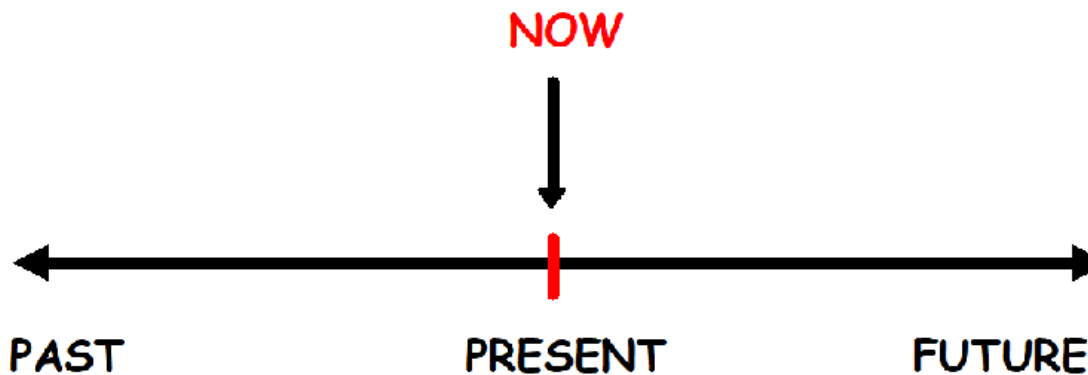
PRESENT NOW - POINT IN TIME

I work and it's not an emergency, I'll call you on my lunch hour.

You relax now, while I fix dinner.

We appeal to you now, to stop Human Sex Trafficking!

They numb the area so you won't feel a thing.



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Simple Future – Example 1 using the word “will” to precede or go before the Root or Base word form AND THE USE OF ADVERBS LIKE: “before,” “after,” “later,” “then,” and/or CONJUNCTIONS LIKE “but” to indicate sequence.

Used with ALL Pronouns I, you, she, he, it, we, and they, OR their equivalent.

I will work...

You will train...

He will volunteer...

She will earn...

It will help...

We will journal...

They will aim...

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SIMPLE FUTURE - EXAMPLE 1

FUTURE REGULARLY SCHEDULED INCOMPLETE EVENTS

I will work the 3 to 11 shift for the next 6 months.

You will train the dog every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.

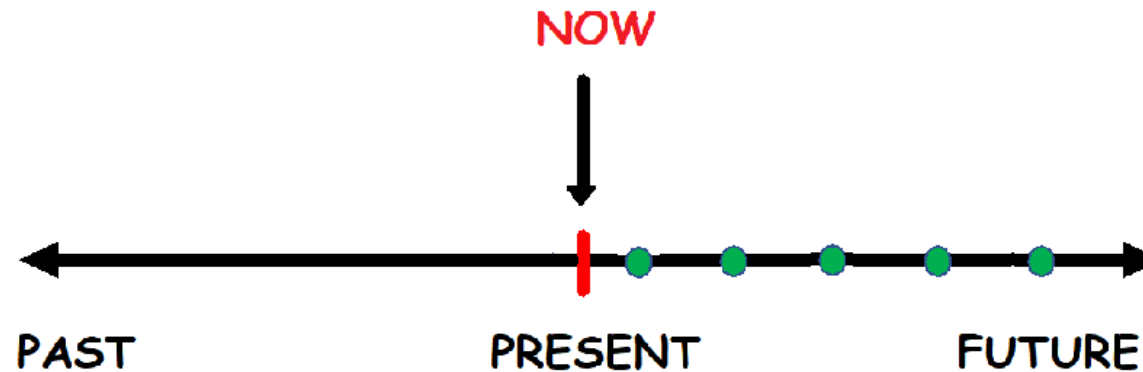
Every weekday, he will volunteer at the local soup kitchen.

She will earn \$100.00 per day during the 5 day period.

The new vacuum will help your mom clean every day.

We will journal every day to increase our writing skills.

They will aim for a 60% increase over the next six months.



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Simple Future – Example 2 using the word “will” to precede or go before the Root or Base word form AND THE USE OF ADVERBS LIKE: “before, “after,” “later,” “then,” and/or CONJUNCTIONS LIKE “but” to indicate sequence.

Used with ALL Pronouns I, you, she, he, it, we, and they, OR their equivalent.

I will cook...

You will enter...

He will check...

She will weed...

It will learn...

We will attend...

They will construct...

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SIMPLE FUTURE - EXAMPLE 2

FUTURE - FORWARD TO ONE POINT IN TIME

I will cook supper this evening.

You will enter law school in one year.

He will check the parking meters later today.

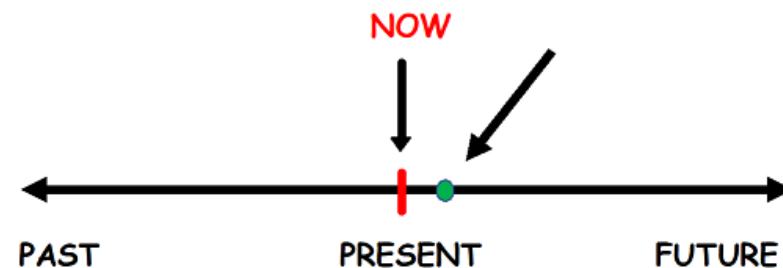
She will weed the garden later this afternoon.

It will learn to sit at dog training tomorrow.

We will attend a concert on Sept. 16th.

They will construct a fort in the backyard after nap time.

This point on a timeline would be the near future.
