You tried to accomplish your own work goals every day.

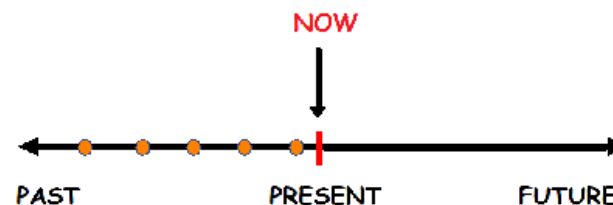
He studied for his spelling test every day before the test.

You busied yourself after your husband died to get over the loss.

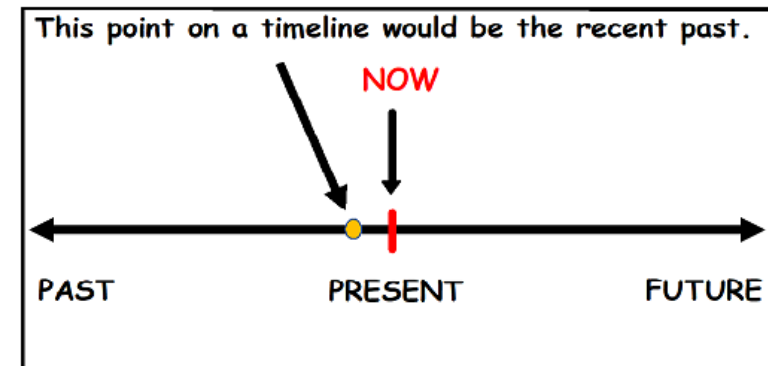
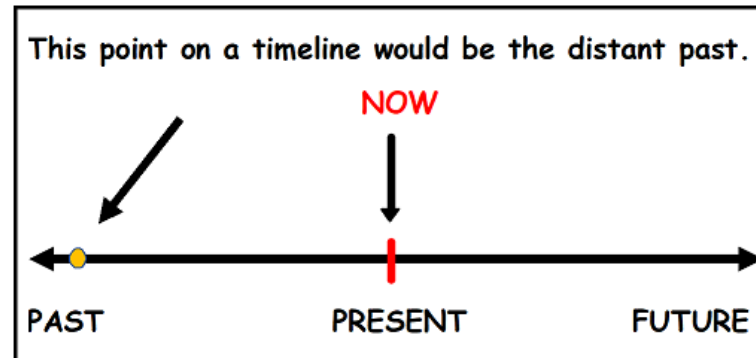
The Lord Jesus Christ embodied love in dying on the cross for our sins.

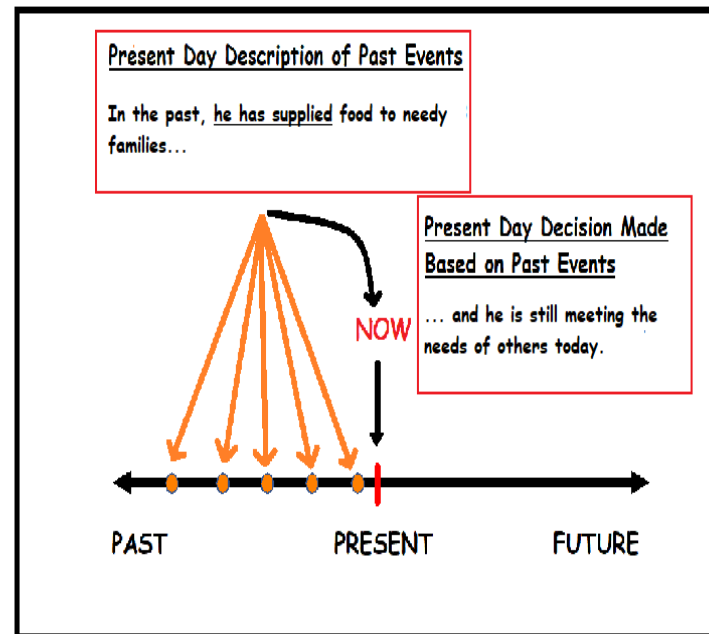

PRESENT - 1 OR MORE EVENTS IN THE PAST THAT ARE PERTINENT TO THE PRESENT AND MAY/MAY NOT BE AFFECTING EVENTS HAPPENING IN THE PRESENT



I have studied and been approved as a certified teacher in the past and now I use ALL of those skills in my current work.

You have satisfied all the requirements for the job and you have been hired.

She has notified the authorities 5 times concerning issues with the heat in the apartment and the landlord has finally complied with the regulations.

The squirrel has buried nuts during the spring and summer and now it has come back during the winter to collect them.

We have identified, collected, and pressed fall leaves and today we're making a leaf banner.

They have modified the way things have been done in the past and now things work more efficiently.

You had applied to several colleges before you were accepted.

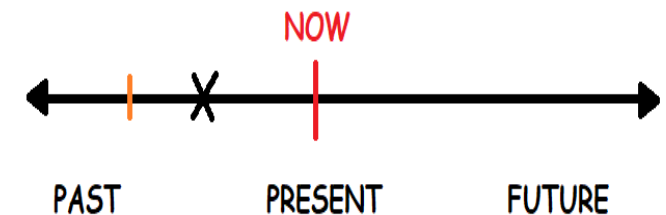
He had carried his medical records to the new doctor before his appointment.

They will have busied themselves playing basketball before their mother arrives.
