SIMPLE PRESENT

Example 1 using the Root or Base word form.

Used with the Pronouns I, you, we, or they :

I agree...

You guarantee...

We tiptoe...

They free...

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SIMPLE PRESENT - EXAMPLE 1

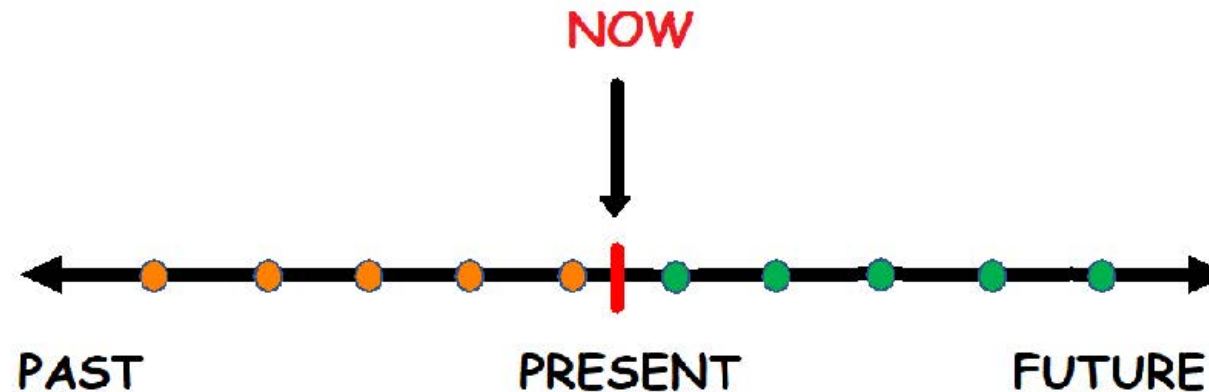
PRESENT REGULARLY SCHEDULED COMPLETED EVENTS

I agree daily with the Lord Jesus Christ that Satan is a defeated foe!

You guarantee regularly that your products are produced without defect or the buyer gets all of their money back.

We tiptoe into the baby's room every morning to see if he's awake.

They free the chickens from their coop every morning at break of day.



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SIMPLE PRESENT

Example 2 using the Root or Base word form.

Used with the Pronouns I, you, we, or they :

I agree...

You glue...

We guarantee...

They dye...

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SIMPLE PRESENT - EXAMPLE 2

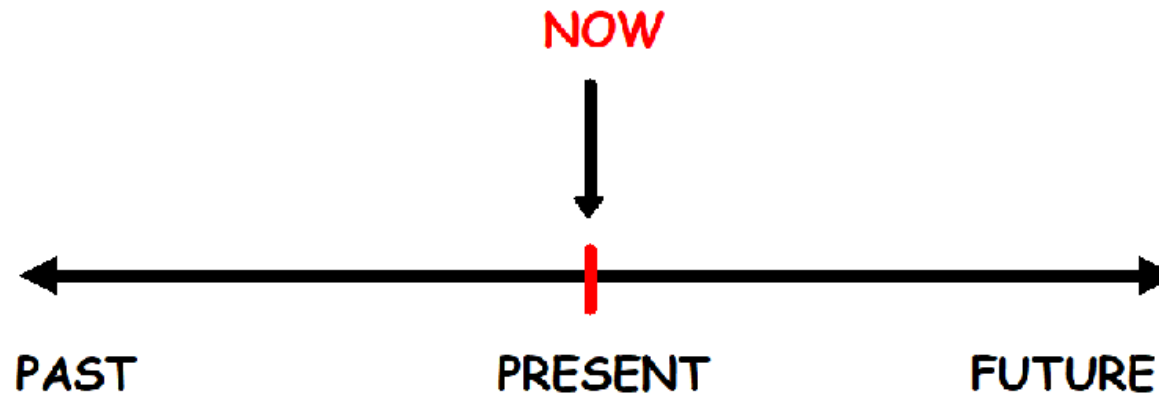
PRESENT NOW - POINT IN TIME

I agree with the Lord that foul language should be wiped out now.

You glue stamps on the envelopes and I'll address them.

We guarantee that it will work.

They dye leather.



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Simple Future – Example 1 using the word “will” to precede or go before the Root or Base word form AND THE USE OF ADVERBS LIKE: “before, “after,” “later,” “then,” and/or CONJUNCTIONS LIKE “but” to indicate sequence.

Used with ALL Pronouns I, you, she, he, it, we, and they, OR their equivalent.

I will dye...

You will free...

He will glue...

She will decree...

It will eye...

We will tree...

They will tiptoe...

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SIMPLE FUTURE - EXAMPLE 1

FUTURE REGULARLY SCHEDULED INCOMPLETE EVENTS

I will dye the wool at work every day.

You will free the chickens every morning from now on.

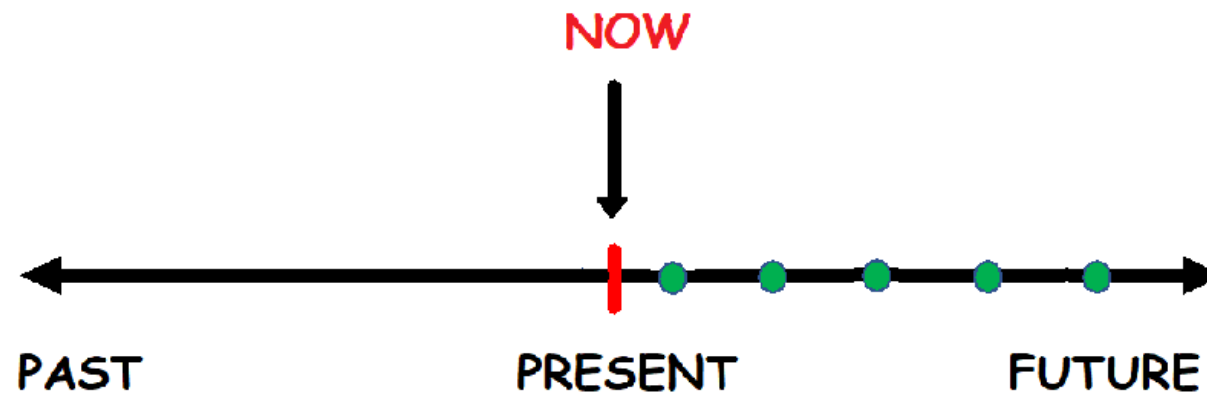
He will glue the chairs each day at work.

She will decree the sentences of the defendants in court regularly.

The dog will eye the sheep to keep them safe each day.

We will tree a fox monthly on our fox hunt.

Daily, they will tiptoe into the nursery to check on the baby.



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Simple Future – Example 2 using the word “will” to precede or go before the Root or Base word form AND THE USE OF ADVERBS LIKE: “before, “after,” “later,” “then,” and/or CONJUNCTIONS LIKE “but” to indicate sequence.

Used with ALL Pronouns I, you, she, he, it, we, and they, OR their equivalent.

I will free...

You will decree...

He will guarantee...

She will agree...

It will glue...

We will disagree...

They will dye...

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SIMPLE FUTURE - EXAMPLE 2

FUTURE - FORWARD TO ONE POINT IN TIME

I will free the goat from its pen tomorrow morning.

You will decree the sentence of the defendant on Wednesday.

He will guarantee the product for 5 years from the date of purchase.

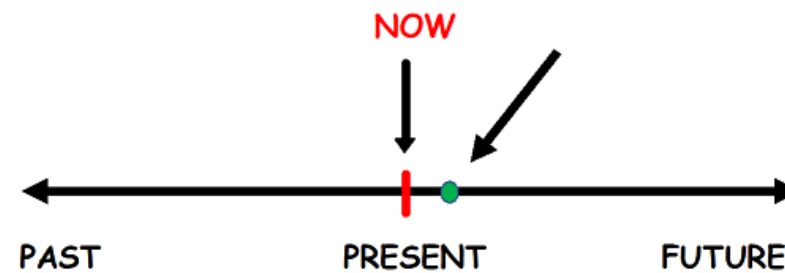
She said she will agree to the terms of the sale on Tuesday.

The machine will glue the envelopes shut tomorrow morning.

We will disagree with the bill presented before Congress on Thursday.

They will dye the wool tomorrow morning so we can card it on Friday.

This point on a timeline would be the near future.



This point on a timeline would be the distant future.
