SIMPLE PRESENT - EXAMPLE 1


PRESENT REGULARLY SCHEDULED COMPLETED EVENTS

You zip your jacket every day, it's too cold outside!

We trap lobsters daily off of Penobscot Bay.

They knit blankets for the homeless yearly.

SIMPLE PRESENT - EXAMPLE 2


PRESENT NOW - POINT IN TIME

I jam a lot of work into one day.

You lug heavy trash cans for a living.

We plan commercial building projects.

They map out directions on-line.

Simple Future - Example 1 using the word "will" to precede or go before the Root or Base word form AND THE USE OF ADVERBS LIKE: "before, "after," "later," "then," and/or CONJUNCTIONS LIKE "but" to indicate sequence.

Used with ALL Pronouns I, you, she, he, it, we, and they, OR their equivalent.

I will whip up...

You will mop...

He will jog...

She will drum...

It will deter...

We will chop...

They will plan...

FUTURE REGULARLY SCHEDULED INCOMPLETE EVENTS

I will whip up a nice dinner every Friday when my in-laws come over.

You will mop the restaurant floor each night before closing.


He will jog daily to increase his endurance.

She will drum at her weekly band rehearsals.

The camera at the signal light will deter people from running through it daily.

We will chop vegetables for submarine sandwiches every morning.

They will plan company issues at the weekly morning meeting held on Saturdays.

You will grab...

He will thin...

She will scan...

He will thin the bushes this Saturday.


She will scan her computer this evening.
