PAST REGULARLY SCHEDULED COMPLETED EVENTS

ADD D TO THE ROOT WORD

I completed the lessons daily.

You cycled 25 miles to the nearest town and back every day.

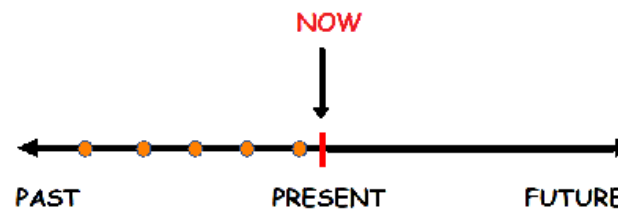
He danced at the local studio to give lessons on a monthly basis.

She divided the snacks equally between the children each day.

The company donated money to the poor yearly.

We drizzled strawberry syrup into our milk every morning.

Every morning, they dedicated their time to prayer for all mankind.

they, OR their equivalent.

You devised...

PAST - BACK TO ONE POINT IN TIME

You devised a plan that worked out well for the company.

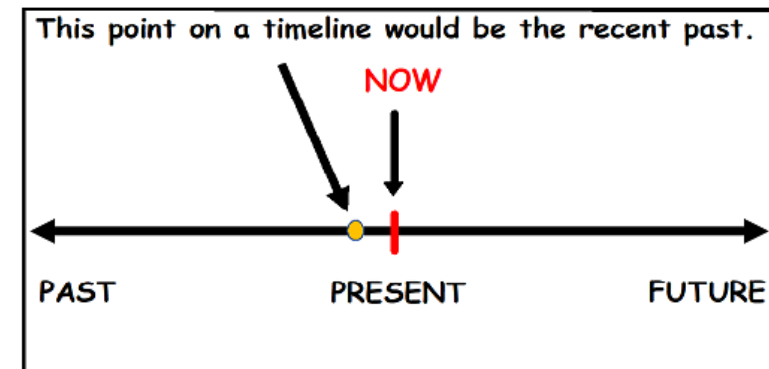
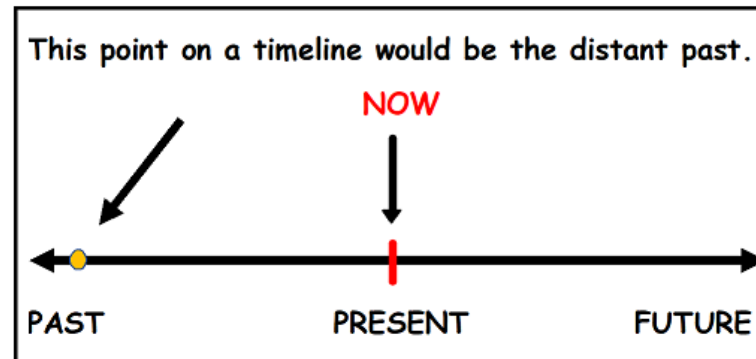
He emerged the victor against the powers of darkness.

We have moved...

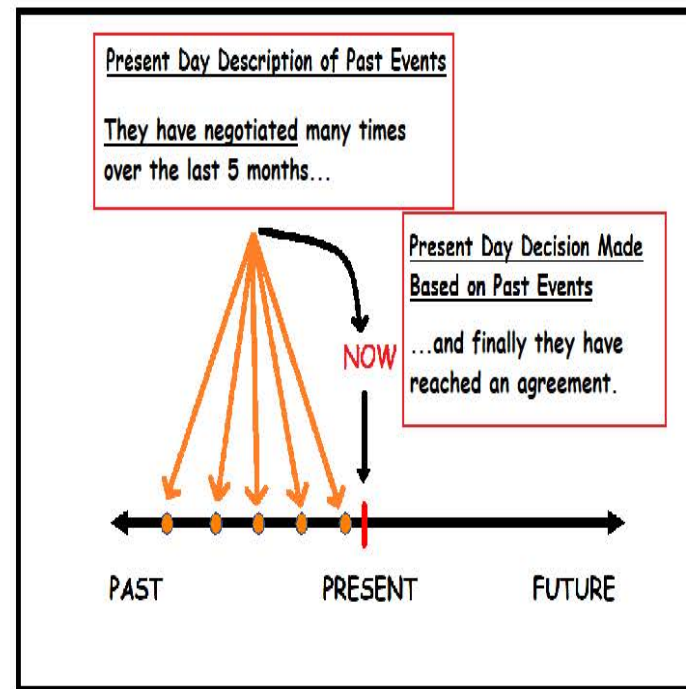

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PRESENT PERFECT

PRESENT - 1 OR MORE EVENTS IN THE PAST THAT ARE PERTINENT TO THE PRESENT AND MAY/MAY NOT BE AFFECTING EVENTS HAPPENING IN THE PRESENT



I have fenced the pasture several times, but this last time it has lasted longer.

You have practiced your violin for the last 5 months and now you're ready for the recital.

He has hiked a portion of the Appalachian Trail 3 times before, but now he's hiking the full length of it.

She has injured her knee multiple times and now requires surgery.

It has invaded the garden several times and I finally put a fence around the area.

We have moved many times with my Dad having been in the military, but now that he has retired, we can stay in one place.

They have negotiated many times over the last 5 months and finally they have reached an agreement.

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PAST PERFECT

Yesterday, I had taped the package shut and then later that day, realized I forgot to put in one item.

You had tackled many obstacles in your lifetime and then later overcame them through Christ.

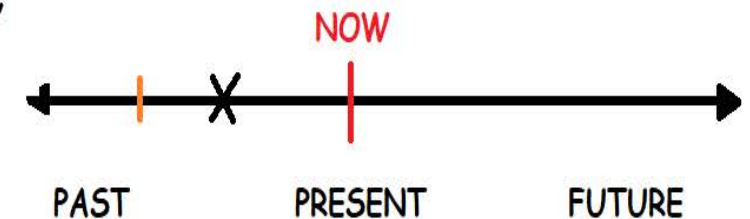
He had struggled with Math, but later when he worked with a tutor, he excelled.

She had survived through all kinds of abuse and then was completely healed by the Lord Jesus Christ.

The computer had narrated the story to the blind student and afterwards he was able to complete his writing assignment.

At the meeting last week, we had proved our point and a day later, everyone came to an agreement.

A month ago, they had pasted bulletins with a picture of their lost dog all over town, then 2 weeks later someone found it.

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FUTURE PERFECT

FUTURE - A SENTENCE MAKING A COMPARISON BETWEEN HOW 2 OR MORE SEQUENTIAL EVENTS OCCUR IN A FUTURE TIME FRAME.

Today after leaving, I will have arranged the hotel reservation before we reach Plymouth, Massachusetts.

Tomorrow, you will have approved the contract before I arrive to celebrate it.

This afternoon, he will have assembled the bike before the birthday party this evening.

Tomorrow, she will have baked a cake before the guests arrive.

This afternoon, the machine will have assembled all of the order before the truck comes to pick it up for shipment.

On Monday, we will have arrived before your mother who is coming on Tuesday morning.

Tonight, they will have closed the deal before the moving truck comes tomorrow.
