Simple PAST – Example 1
Using the Root or Base
word form which has an Ee
at the end and ADDING D
TO IT.

Used with ALL Pronouns I,
you, he, she, it, we, and
they, OR their equivalent.

I decreed...

You eyed...

He freed...

She tiptoed...

It dyed...

We glued...

They guaranteed...

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SIMPLE PAST - EXAMPLE 1

PAST REGULARLY SCHEDULED COMPLETED EVENTS

I decreed the words of the Lord daily.

You eyed the blueberry pie daily when we would stop in for a snack.

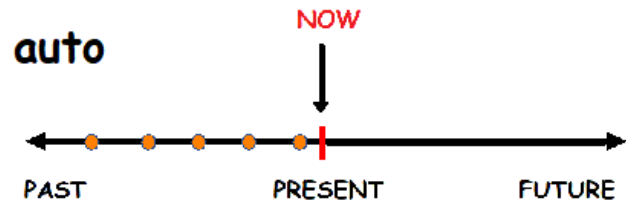
He freed the chickens every day, so that they could eat the bugs in the grass.

Each day, she tiptoed into the baby's room to see if it was still asleep.

The machine dyed the wool on a time schedule to prepare it for being spun into yarn.

At work, we glued the furniture together every day.

They guaranteed all of their weekly repairs at the auto mechanic's place.



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Simple PAST – Example 2 Using the Root or Base word form which has an Ee at the end and ADDING D TO IT.

Used with ALL Pronouns I, you, he, she, it, we, and they, OR their equivalent.

I dyed...

You guaranteed...

He disagreed...

She agreed...

It treed...

We tiptoed...

They glued...

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SIMPLE PAST - EXAMPLE 2

ADD D TO THE ROOT WORD

PAST - BACK TO ONE POINT IN TIME

I dyed 10 T-shirts yesterday.

You guaranteed the lawn mower for 5 years from when I purchased it.

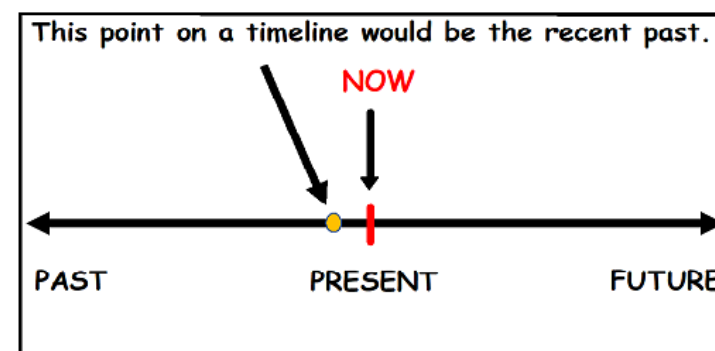
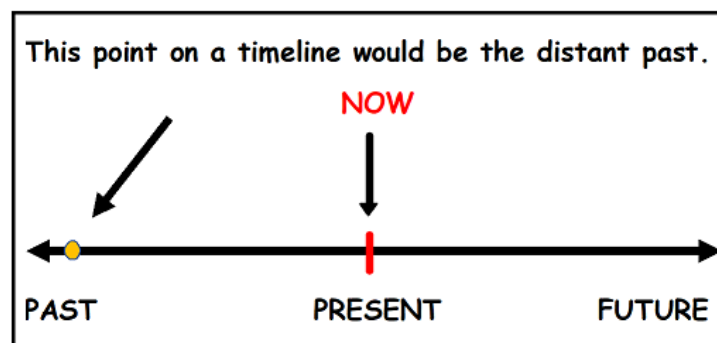
He disagreed with the comments made in yesterday's speech.

She agreed with what was said in yesterday's speech.

It treed the cat this morning and I had to call the fire department to rescue it.

We tiptoed around the apartment last night, so we wouldn't wake the children.

They glued the broken chair together this afternoon.



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PRESENT PERFECT Using the Root or Base word form which has an Ee at the end and ADDING D TO IT -

PLUS HELPING VERBS - "have" OR "has" AND THE USE OF ADVERBS LIKE: "before," "after," "later," "then," and/or CONJUNCTIONS LIKE "but" to indicate sequence.

Used with ALL Pronouns I, you, he, she, it, we, and they, OR their equivalent.

I have tie dyed...

You have eyed...

He has agreed...

She has agreed...

It has treed...

We have disagreed...

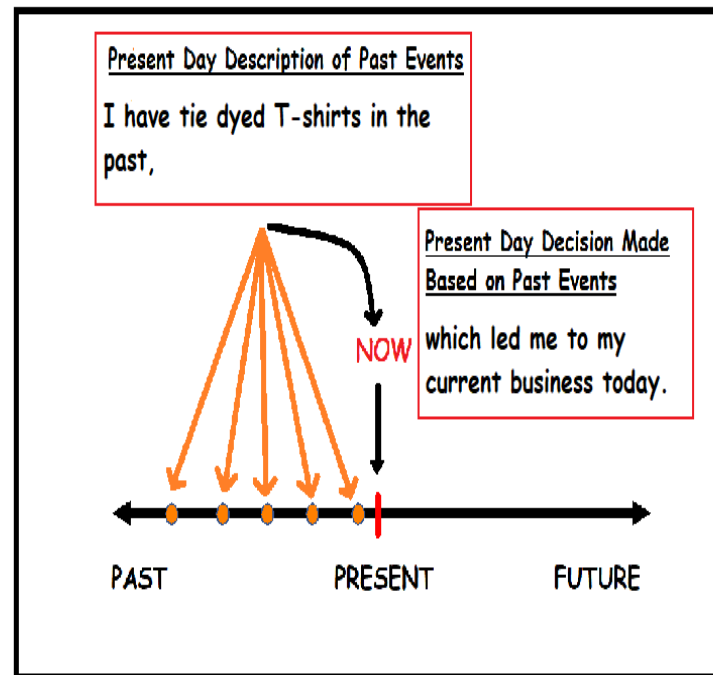
They have tiptoed...

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PRESENT PERFECT

PRESENT - 1 OR MORE EVENTS IN THE PAST THAT ARE PERTINENT TO THE PRESENT AND MAY/MAY NOT BE AFFECTING EVENTS HAPPENING IN THE PRESENT



I have tie dyed T-shirts in the past, which led me to my current business today.

You have eyed that blouse every time we have come into this store and because it's your birthday, today I am buying it.

For the past 2 years he has agreed to mow the lawn, but now he wants to change jobs.

For the past 5 years she has agreed to go to the beach, but this year she wants to go to the mountains.

It has treed that squirrel so many times in the past that now it has given up!

We have disagreed about so many things in the past that now we had to part as friends.

They have tiptoed around the subject of buying a bigger home in the past and today they did it!

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PAST PERFECT Using the Root or Base word form which has an Ee at the end and ADDING D TO IT -

PLUS THE HELPING VERB - "had" AND THE USE OF ADVERBS LIKE: "before, "after," "later," "then," and/or CONJUNCTIONS LIKE "but" to indicate sequence.

Used with ALL Pronouns I, you, he, she, it, we, and they, OR their equivalent.

I had already glued...

You had eyed...

He had agreed...

She had freed...

It had eyed...

We had treed...

They had secretly tiptoed...

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PAST PERFECT

PAST - A SENTENCE MAKING A COMPARISON BETWEEN HOW 2 OR MORE SEQUENTIAL EVENTS OCCUR IN A PAST TIME FRAME.

I had written the letter yesterday and then noticed this morning that I had already glued the envelope shut without the letter inside.

You had eyed that car on the lot a month before and then finally bought it 2 weeks later.

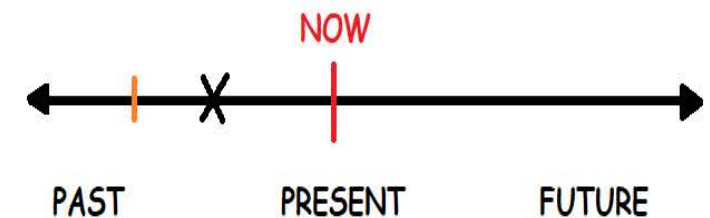
He had agreed to pay the debt and then 3 weeks later lost his job.

She had freed the bird from its enclosure after it was healed.

It had eyed the garbage can weeks ago and yesterday came back to get lunch.

Two weeks ago, we had treed the bear and afterwards called animal control.

Five years ago, they had secretly tiptoed in and then everyone yelled, "Surprise!"



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FUTURE PERFECT Using the Root or Base word form which has an Ee at the end and ADDING D TO IT -

PLUS THE HELPING VERBS - "will have" AND THE USE OF ADVERBS

LIKE: "before," "after," "later," "then," and/or CONJUNCTIONS LIKE "but" to indicate sequence.

Used with ALL Pronouns I, you, he, she, it, we, and they, OR their equivalent.

I will have dyed...

You will have glued...

He will have decreed...

She will have freed...

It will have eyed...

We will have tiptoed...

They will have freed...

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FUTURE PERFECT

FUTURE - A SENTENCE MAKING A COMPARISON BETWEEN HOW 2 OR MORE SEQUENTIAL EVENTS OCCUR IN A FUTURE TIME FRAME.

I will have dyed the T-shirts before the new orders come in.

You will have glued and repaired the table leg before the company arrives.

He will have decreed the outcome of the trial before it is made public.

She will have freed the bird before it grows dependent on man.

The camera will have eyed the person before they have even approached the door.

We will have tiptoed in before the baby wakes up with grandma.

They will have freed the animal before the anesthetic wears off.
