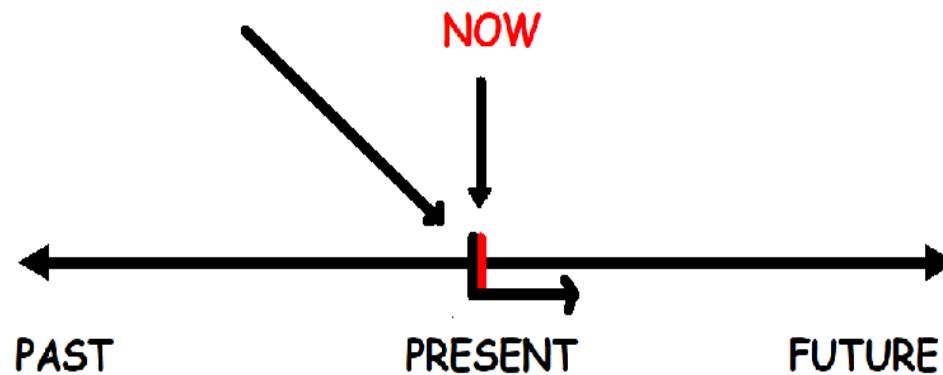

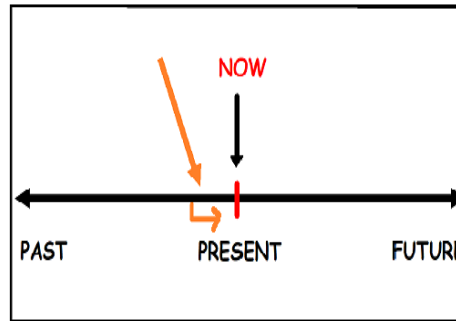

PAST PROGRESSIVE OR CONTINUOUS

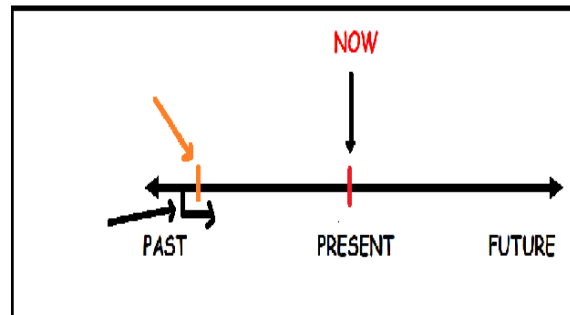
PAST - ACTION IN PROGRESS

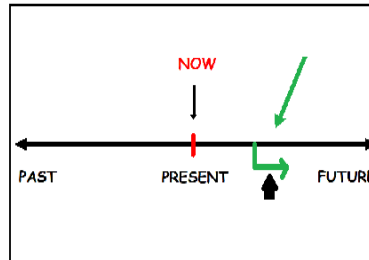

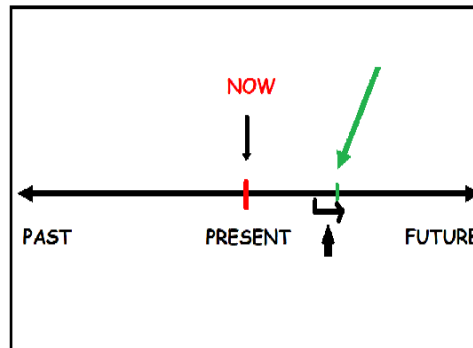

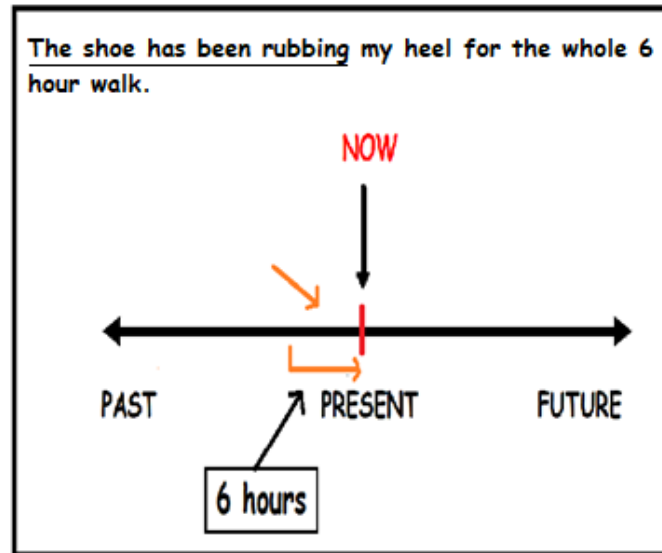

PRESENT - EVENTS THAT START IN THE PAST, ARE STILL OCCURRING, AND COULD CONTINUE, THAT ARE PERTINENT TO PRESENT CONVERSATION



I have been dripping with sweat after working in the garden this summer.

You have been drumming up business for your company for the last 6 months.

The Lord has been dispelling lies for centuries.

She has been dipping into her 401K to meet her needs for the last year.

We have been emitting fossil fuels for ages.

They have been equipping people for ministry for many years.

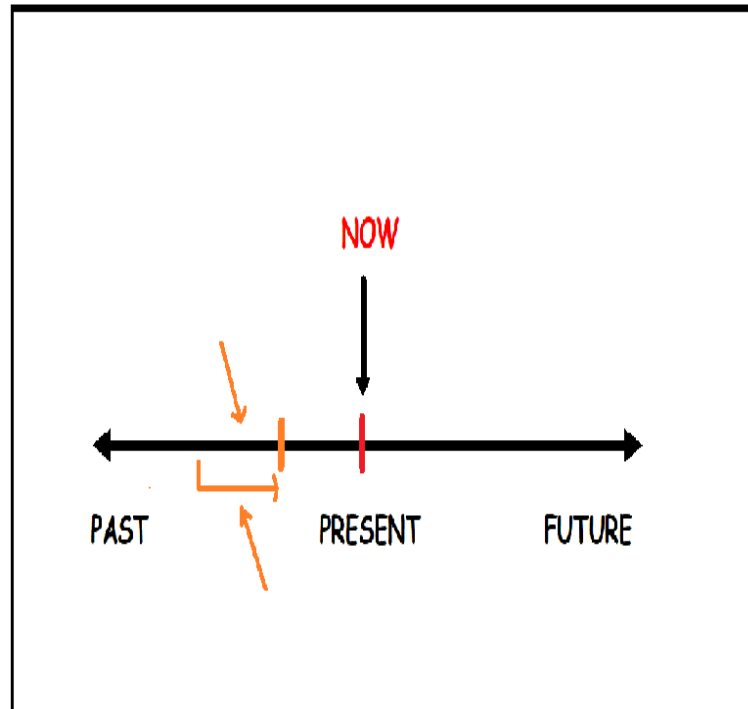

PAST PERFECT PROGRESSIVE OR CONTINUOUS

PAST - 1 CONTINUOUS EVENT THAT IS INTERRUPTED BY ANOTHER EVENT



I had been embedding videos on my website when I stopped because of a thunderstorm.

You had been lagging behind in your studies, but thanks to the Lord's help, you became a straight A student.

He had been nipping at people's heels, but because of dog training he stopped.

She had been petting the dog, but the owner warned that it could bite.

It had been plugging along, but then the fuel pump went bad.

We had been lobbing back and forth, but it began to rain heavily.

They had been bussing children to other districts, but parents complained. (Note: It can also be spelled "busing")

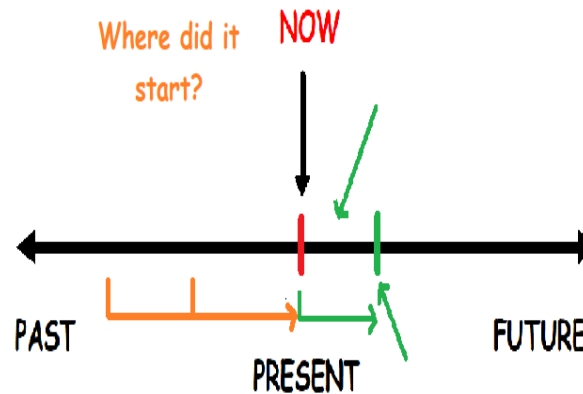

FUTURE PERFECT PROGRESSIVE OR CONTINUOUS

FUTURE - ONE EVENT THAT BEGINS IN THE PAST, OR PRESENT THAT CONTINUES INTO THE FUTURE UNTIL ANOTHER EVENT INTERRUPTS IT, A FUTURE DATE BRINGS IT TO COMPLETION, OR A GOAL IS ATTAINED.

At 2:00 p.m. they will have been napping for 1 hour.



I will have been equipping young people for about 20 years in one capacity or another when the New Year is birthed.

You will have been flipping pancakes at the local restaurant for a year when you start culinary school in the fall.

He will have been lapping the track for 20 years come this January.

She will have been mapping towns and cities as a cartographer for 30 years in February when she retires.

The company will have been jarring mayonaise for 50 years in March.

We will have been shopping for four hours by the time our husbands come back to pick us up.
