FUTURE - ONE EVENT THAT BEGINS IN THE PAST, OR PRESENT THAT CONTINUES INTO THE FUTURE UNTIL ANOTHER EVENT INTERRUPTS IT, A FUTURE DATE BRINGS IT TO COMPLETION, OR A GOAL IS ATTAINED.



When you become a teacher, <u>you will have been</u> enriching thousands of lives before you retire.

When he becomes a doctor, he will have been in training for about 10 to 14 years before he completes medical school.

One year from now, she will have been working at her job for 20 years.

The wildlife camera <u>will have been viewing</u> animals for an added 2 hours before the battery runs out.

Two years from now, we will have been working in this business for 40 years.

They will have been repairing the car for an additional 5 hours then what they estimated.
