Psalm 115:1

^{"1} Not to us, LORD, not to us but to your name be the glory, because of your love and faithfulness." (NIV) What is a SIMILE and how is it used in writing?

The Lord used SIMILES (pronounced sim-ahlees) in this book. A Simile is a comparison made between two things by using the words "like" or "as." SIMILES are used in creative writing to describe something. If you didn't have the pictures in this book and you only had the words, the words would still create a picture in your mind. When YOU are writing a SIMILE, the object you are making a comparison to, must be something well known to everyone. Sometimes the comparisons can be good and sometimes they are not.

Things found in nature are commonly used in SIMILES. The Lord uses SIMILES in the Bible. For example: in the book of Revelation the Bible says:


Revelation 1:14 New International Version ^{"14} The hair on his head was white like wool, as white as snow, and his eyes were like blazing fire." (NIV) There are 3 similes in that one scripture. Christ's hair color is being compared to the wool on a sheep – "white <u>like</u> wool" (NIV) It is also being compared to the snow – "white <u>as</u> snow." (NIV) His eyes are being compared "were <u>like</u> a blazing fire." (NIV)

The Lord used things people would be familiar with to make the comparisons. Most people know how white a sheep's wool is and how white snow is. They know what a blazing fire looks like too. See how it creates a picture in the reader's mind? In another scripture though, the comparison is not pleasant. In Isaiah 64:6; the Lord USED 3 SIMILES: 1. the people had all become <u>like</u> one who is unclean. 2. comparing what the people <u>thought</u> were righteous acts to filthy rags. It means sometimes WE think our acts are good, but God doesn't think so! He thinks they are filthy rags. 3. He also says when we sin, we are like a leaf being blown in the wind sweeping us away.


Isaiah 64:6

"All of us have become <u>like</u> one who is unclean, and all our righteous acts are <u>like</u> filthy rags; we all shrivel up <u>like</u> a leaf, and <u>like</u> the wind our sins sweep us away."(NIV) When you are doing something for the Lord and for others you need to MAKE SURE it is really GOOD IN GOD'S EYES! In this book, the Lord includes some SIMILES and He also includes pictures that will make the comparisons obvious, but remember, when you read the WORDS - they will create a picture in your mind of what the Lord is describing.


At the end of this book, you'll find some riddles that are making comparisons in the form of SIMILES. See if you can guess what the SIMILE is describing.




I remember Brin, who had an identical twin named Flin.




Their kin went by the name of Flanagin.

They would do anything for you, just like kin,...






...and overflowed with love like a fountain.



They played mandolin at a country inn...


... and everyone loved their singing.

2. My nose is long like a hose and I can suck water up into it so I can take a drink. What am I?


3. My tail is flat like a pancake and I use it to hold sticks in place with mud to build my home? What am I?


