Schwa Ee pronounced "uh"

item - I went to the store and bought an item.

the - The boy was ten years old.

tandem – A tandem bicycle allows 2 riders at the same time.

syst<u>em - Our system</u> of government has many interconnecting parts that make up the whole government.

Anth<u>e</u>m - The National <u>Anthem</u> of the United States of America is the Star-Spangled Banner.

probl<u>em – A problem</u> is a question or difficulty that requires a solution.

embl<u>e</u>m – An <u>emblem</u> is a logo or symbol representing a particular group.

barr<u>el</u> - A <u>barrel</u> is a rounded wooden container with staves that hold it together.

funn<u>e</u>I - A <u>funnel</u> is a special container with a wide opening at one end and a small opening at the other to allow the transfer of solids or liquids into smaller container openings, so that none of the materials are lost or wasted.

bushel - I picked a <u>bushel</u> of apples.

Bethel - In the Bible, Bethel means "house of God."

shov<u>e</u>I – A <u>shovel</u> is a metal or plastic tool used to move materials from one place to another, for example, a garden or snow shovel.

enam<u>el</u> – <u>Enamel</u> is a chemical agent added to paint and other substances to make it longer lasting and shinier.

Muss<u>el</u> – A <u>mussel</u> is a salt or freshwater member of the bivalve mollusk family that is usually dark in color.

mant<u>el</u> – A <u>mantel</u> is an area above a fireplace used for decoration.

Cam<u>el – A camel</u> is a mammal with 2 large humps of fat on its back.

chap<u>e</u>l - A <u>chapel</u> is a smaller church or sacred area within a building.

travel – To travel means to move about from place to place.

tunn<u>e</u>l – A <u>tunnel</u> is an opening or tube-like structure that can be small or large that allows movement from one place to another.

Weas<u>el</u> - A <u>weasel</u> is a clever, small, thin nocturnal mammal that burrows under the ground.

cam<u>e</u>ra – A <u>camera</u> is a mechanism used to take photographs or pictures.

El<u>ephant (the 2nd e and the a is also a schwa)</u>– An <u>elephant</u> is the largest land mammal found naturally on the continent of Africa and in Southeast Asia. cel<u>e</u>brate (the schwa is in the 2nd Ee "cel- uh" – To <u>celebrate</u> means to honor a special occasion, for example, a special day or accomplishment.

tel<u>ephone</u> (and the 2nd Ee is where the schwa is "tel-uh-- A <u>telephone</u> is a long-distance communication device.

Pres<u>ident – A President</u> is a leader of a country or organization.

an<u>i</u>mal – An <u>animal</u> is one of those creations differing from a human being and a plant.

easily - <u>Easily</u> means the opposite of hard or difficult.

acc<u>ident – An accident</u> is something that occurs without it's being done purposefully.

conf<u>i</u>dence – <u>Confidence</u> means a characteristic of achieving a sense of security in doing something well.

civ<u>i</u>l – <u>Civil</u> means to treat in a respectful way or having to do with citizens.

pup<u>i</u>l – A <u>pupil</u> can mean a student or a part of the human eye.

pencil – A pencil is a writing tool made of wood and graphite.

vig<u>i</u>l – A <u>vigil</u> is when a group of people have a quiet time of concentrated prayer.

anv<u>i</u>l – An <u>anvil</u> is an iron bench tool used to shape metal commonly used by blacksmiths.

evil – Evil is the opposite of good.

tons<u>il</u> – A <u>tonsil</u> is one of 2 clumps of soft tissue that is located on each side of the throat.

stenc<u>il</u> – A <u>stencil</u> is a cut out that produces a picture when paint is dabbed onto a surface.
