## God's Vowel \& Consonant Digraphs, Trigraphs, and Quadgraphs

(An excerpt from the whole document)
Lesson 6
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## Psalm 115:1

"1 Not to us, LORD, not to us but to your name be the glory. because of your love and faithfulness." (NIV)

The word "Digraph" has 2 parts: "di" meaning 2 and "graph" meaning written. A "digraph" means there are 2 written letters that make 1 spoken sound.

The word "Trigraph" has 3 parts: "Tri" meaning 3 and "graph" meaning written. A "Trigraph" means there are 3 written letters that make 1 spoken sound.

## The word

"Quadgraph" has 4 parts: "Quad" meaning 4 and "graph" meaning written. A "Quadgraph" means there are 4 written letters that make 1 spoken sound.

Every Vowel Diphthong with 2 vowels IS ALSO a Digraph. A problem arises with diphthongs because vowels come together in MORE THAN just groups of 2. For example: in the word "beau" which makes the long Oo sound. We choose NOT to use the term "diphthong," because it is VERY confusing to people. Instead, we group them all together under one of three terms: - Vowel and Consonant Digraphs, Trigraphs, or Quadgraphs.

These are the most common digraphs, trigraphs, and quadgraphs. The more familiar you make yourself with words that have these letters and sounds and in what words they do occur, the more you will remember them.

The more you read them, the more fluent you will become as a reader meaning you will read accurately, smoother, and faster.

## LK as in "Yolk" = the LI is Silent with the Kk sound heard.

Here are some words with the Digraph LK as in "Yolk" (o) = the LI is Silent with the Kk sound heard.

LM as in "Palm" = the Aa sound is as in "ah," the LI is Silent, with the Mm sound heard.

Here are some words with the Digraph LM as in "Palm" * = the Aa sound is as in "ah," the $L I$ is Silent, with the Mm sound heard.

LV as in "Halves" = the LI is Silent and the Vv sound is heard.

## MB as in "Comb" = the Mm sound is heard and the $B b$ is Silent.

Here are some words with the Digraph MB as in Comb $=$ the $M m$ sound is heard and the $B b$ is Silent.

## MN as in "Autumn" = the Mm sound is heard and the Nn is Silent.

"Autumn" = the Mm sound is heard and the Nn is Silent.

NDK in "handkerchief" is influenced by the vowel= the sound "ank." (the Dd is Silent)

NG as in "King."

NG can be used as a digraph, a blend, or within a compound word. Just because you see NG together don't assume it is a digraph. Remember, a digraph is when 2 written letters make one sound. Let's look at the difference.

In the Digraph NG used in "tong," you don't hear the " $n$ " sound or the " 9 " sound. The " $N G$ " sound is different and makes a unique sound of it's own. It is 1 sound.

In the Blend NG used in "messenger" you hear the " $n$ " sound and the soft " 9 " sound. You hear 2 distinct sounds.

In the Compound word "mangrove," you hear 2 distinct sounds as well, " $n$ " and hard " 9 ", and they do not blend together.

The NG digraph produces a sound which is neither the Nn sound nor the Gg sound. It makes the sound of "NG." Let's look at all 5 vowels when used with the "NG" sound with the consonant Ss in the front.

When you say those words you do not hear the Nn sound nor the Gg sounds (soft or hard). The word "seng" shown above is a nonsense word, but it can be found in the word "ginseng."

Like the NG Digraph, the NK Digraph is difficult to say without a vowel in front of it.

The word "benk" shown above is a nonsense word, but if the Letter Jj is used to make "jenk instead, it IS used in the name "Jenkins."
