

God Presents: Words with the Letter Rr that DO NOT Control the Vowels in Them

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Some people incorrectly teach
 that an R always controls a
 vowel. This is **NOT TRUE!**
 There **ARE** exceptions.

When **DOESN'T** an R Control a vowel?

Let's find out with the word "arose," meaning
 past tense of "arise." When I say, "past
 tense" it means the word is referring to
 something that has already happened. Using
 the word in a sentence we could say, "The
 sun arose at 6:30 this morning."

So, in that word "arose" is the vowel
 controlled by the Rr?

Here is where syllabication comes
 into play. To count the syllables in
 a word, just put your hand under
 your chin and say the word slowly.
 As you go, count the number of
 times your chin hits your hand.

The count that you get tells you
 how many syllables there are in
 the word.

Let's say the word "arose" and see. Hold
 your hand under your chin and say the word
 "arose" meaning past tense of "arise."

"a-rose" - The word "arose" has 2
 syllables. The "A" makes the sound "uh" and
 is operating totally on its own in a separate
 syllable - "a-rose." In that word the letter
 R IS NOT controlling the vowel sound.

arose a-rose

 where the R **DOES NOT** control the
 vowel A.

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Here are some words with the letter R where the R DOES NOT control the vowel E.

	The word using <u>syllabication</u>
erode	e-rod-e
erect	e-rect
erase	e-rase
erupt	e-rupt
erosion	e-ro-sion
deride	de-ride
derive	de-rive

Here are some words with the letter R where the R DOES NOT control the vowel I.

	The word using <u>syllabication</u>
iris	i-ris
irate	i-rate
pirate	pi-rate
irony	i-ro-ny
ironic	i-ro-nic

Here are some words with the letter R where the R DOES NOT control the vowel O.

	The word using <u>syllabication</u>
Orion	O-ri-on (Both O's make the "uh" sound.)

Here are some words with the letter R where the R DOES NOT control the letter U.

	The word using <u>syllabication</u>
urea	u-re-a

Here are some words with the letter R where the R DOES NOT control the letter Y when Y is used to make the sound of a vowel.

	The word using <u>syllabication</u>
pyrite	py-rite
Gyroscope	Gy-ro-scope
Tyrannosaurus	Ty-ran-no-sau-rus

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
