# **God's Time Keeping - The Pattern**

When speaking about His time in the tomb, Christ said this in the New Testament:

**Matthew 12:40 New King James Version** 

"40 For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so will the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth." (NKJV)

When GOD said it was going to be three days and three nights – He meant three complete 24 - hour-days. God does NOT lie. Christ WAS NOT crucified on a Friday. Friday to Sunday is NOT three complete 24-hour days. First, you have to understand some things.

# Open your Bible and look at Genesis 1

**Genesis 1:1-5 New King James Version reads:** 

"1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. <sup>2</sup> The earth was without form, and void; and <u>darkness</u> was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

<sup>3</sup> Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. <sup>4</sup> And God saw the light, that *it was* good; and God divided the light from the darkness. <sup>5</sup> God called the light Day, and the darkness He called Night. So the evening and the morning were the first day."(NKJV)

From the very beginning the same pattern of time keeping for a 24-hour day existed:

Beginning of → Morning → Ending of a a Day and Day

Evening/ Daytime/ Evening/

Darkness Daylight Darkness

Since the first day of the week was created this way, all of the days of the week were also created this way.

God's SPIRITUAL light was always FIRST. A portion of Genesis 1:2 reads "...darkness was [a] on the face of the deep." (NKJV) and then the Lord came on the scene and created natural light and divided the light from the darkness.

Christ was there at the <u>very beginning</u> when the earth was created, but He was there in a spiritual sense, not a physical sense.

#### **Proverbs 8:1-11 New International Version**

"8 Does not wisdom call out? Does not understanding raise her voice? <sup>2</sup> At the highest point along the way, where the paths meet, she takes her stand; <sup>3</sup> beside the gate leading into the city, at the entrance, she cries aloud: <sup>4</sup> "To you, O people, I call out; I raise my voice to all mankind. <sup>5</sup> You who are simple, gain prudence; you who are foolish, set your hearts on it.[a] <sup>6</sup> Listen, for I have trustworthy things to say; open my lips to speak what is right. <sup>7</sup> My mouth speaks what is true, for my lips detest wickedness. 8 All the words of my mouth are just; none of them is crooked or perverse. <sup>9</sup> To the discerning all of them are right; they are upright to those who have found knowledge. <sup>10</sup> Choose my instruction instead of silver, knowledge rather than choice gold, <sup>11</sup> for wisdom is more precious than rubies, and nothing you desire can compare with her." (NIV)

#### **Proverbs 8: 12 - 21 New International Version reads:**

"12 "I, wisdom, dwell together with prudence; I possess knowledge and discretion.

13 To fear the LORD is to hate evil; I hate pride and arrogance, evil behavior and perverse speech. <sup>14</sup> Counsel and sound judgment are mine; I have insight, I have power. 15 By me kings reign and rulers issue decrees that are just; and nobles—all who rule on earth.[b] <sup>17</sup> I love those who love me, and those who seek me find me. 18 With me are riches and honor, enduring wealth and prosperity.

19 My fruit is better than fine gold; what I yield surpasses choice silver.
20 I walk in the way of righteousness, along the paths of justice,
<sup>21</sup> bestowing a rich inheritance on those who love me and making their treasuries full." (NIV)

#### **Proverbs 8:28-36 New International Version**

and fixed securely the fountains of the deep,
and fixed securely the fountains of the deep,
so the waters would not overstep his command,
and when he marked out the foundations of the earth.

Then I was constantly at his side.
I was filled with delight day after day,
rejoicing always in his presence,

all rejoicing in his whole world
and delighting in mankind.

32 "Now then, my children, listen to me;

blessed are those who keep my ways.

33 Listen to my instruction and be wise;
do not disregard it.

34 Blessed are those who listen to me,
watching daily at my doors,
waiting at my doorway.

35 For those who find me find life
and receive favor from the LORD.

36 But those who fail to find me harm themselves;
all who hate me love death."" (NIV)

Later, He temporarily comes to earth in a physical sense as a human being and is here for approximately 33 years. He was conceived as a human being by the Holy Spirit, was crucified, and died for the sins of mankind. Christ's sacrifice on the cross took the place of ALL of the Old Testament sacrifices as an atonement for the sins of all who receive Him as their Savior. His resurrection exemplified what also would happen to us as well – that we would have everlasting life with Him in heaven.

John 8:12 New King James Version (NKJV) reads:

"12 Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."" (NKJV)

**Revelation 1:7-8 New King James Version (NKJV)** 

"7 Behold, He is coming with clouds, and every eye will see Him, even they who pierced Him. And all the tribes of the earth will mourn because of Him. Even so, Amen.

<sup>8</sup> "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End," says the Lord, but who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty."" (NKJV)

From the very FIRST day, the days ran from darkness to darkness NOT from sunset to sunset. WHY?

There was no sunset, because the sun had not even been created yet.

The sun wasn't created until the 4<sup>th</sup> day – when the Lord made the sun, moon, and stars.

In a cloudy sky, ancient man would not be able to determine when sunset occurred, but he COULD tell when darkness occurred even in a cloudy sky. Even today, the only way mankind knows when sunset occurs is through scientific intervention, but God did not intend that mankind would need scientific intervention – He wanted mankind to rely on HIM. He called the darkness "Night" and the light (meaning daylight) he called "Day," and then he called the whole combination of the two "the first day." (Gen 1: 5 NKJV), meaning the first 24-hour day.

# **NEED FURTHER PROOF?**

# Nehemiah 13:19

"19 So it was, at the gates of Jerusalem, as it began to be dark before the Sabbath, that I commanded the gates to be shut, and charged that they must not be opened till after the Sabbath. Then I posted some of my servants at the gates, so that no burdens would be brought in on the Sabbath day."(NKJV)

Notice in that scripture that as it started to become dark they shut the gates of Jerusalem so that peddlers and merchants could not come in to sell their wares and to do business. The Sabbath was a day of rest from work. Darkness was coming on and the sabbath would begin AT darkness.

A man's cloak had to be returned before nightfall, because it was his blanket.

# **Exodus 22:25-27 New King James Version**

"25 "If you lend money to any of My people who are poor among you, you shall not be like a moneylender to him; you shall not charge him interest. 26 If you ever take your neighbor's garment as a pledge, you shall return it to him before the sun goes down. 27 For that is his only covering, it is his garment for his skin. What will he sleep in? And it will be that when he cries to Me, I will hear, for I am gracious." (NKJV)

Even after Christ's crucifixion and resurrection, the days were STILL measured from darkness to darkness. I can prove it through the NEW TESTAMENT. Paul says:

**Ephesians 4:25-27 New King James Version** 

"25 Therefore, putting away lying, "Let each one of you speak truth with his neighbor," [a] for we are members of one another. 26 "Be angry, and do not sin": [b] do not let the sun go down on your wrath, 27 nor give place to the devil." (NKJV)

Sinful actions needed to be dealt with and corrected within the SAME day that they occurred. Every attempt should be made to make sure an offense is not held to the next day. This is STILL true today! REMEMBER according to the Bible the days are STILL measured from darkness to darkness NOT midnight to midnight.

In order to better understand the scriptures, you have to know MORE about ancient time keeping.

Darkness or cloudiness brought one method of time keeping and a sunny day still another. At night, men were assigned the task of keeping watch over the people for their safety and protection. These time periods were called "night watches" (Psalm 63: 6 NKJV) and it is how we got the word "watch" when referring to a wristwatch for keeping time.

Water clocks, candles and oil lamps with marked increments, and sand/hour glasses were used at night to determine the length of each night watch or the hour of day on a cloudy day. (Higgins, Miner, Smith, Sullivan (2004), NIST - National Institute of Standards and Technology, 2004)

In the Old Testament the night watches were divided into thirds: First/Beginning, Middle, and Morning watch.

**Psalm 63:5-7 New King James Version reads:** 

"5 My soul shall be satisfied as with marrow and fatness, And my mouth shall praise *You* with joyful lips.

<sup>6</sup> When I remember You on my bed, I meditate on You in the <u>night watches.</u>

<sup>7</sup> Because You have been my help,
Therefore in the shadow of Your wings I will rejoice."(NKJV)

# **FIRST/BEGINNING WATCH**

**Lamentations 2:18-19 New King James Version** 

"18 Their heart cried out to the Lord,
"O wall of the daughter of Zion,
Let tears run down like a river day and night;
Give yourself no relief;
Give your eyes no rest.

19 "Arise, cry out in the night,
At the beginning of the watches;
Pour out your heart like water before the face of the Lord.
Lift your hands toward Him
For the life of your young children,
Who faint from hunger at the head of every street.""(NKJV)

# **MIDDLE WATCH**

# **Judges 7:18-20 New King James Version**

"18 When I blow the trumpet, I and all who are with me, then you also blow the trumpets on every side of the whole camp, and say, 'The sword of the LORD and of Gideon!"

<sup>19</sup> So Gideon and the hundred men who were with him came to the outpost of the camp at the beginning of the middle watch, just as they had posted the watch; and they blew the trumpets and broke the pitchers that were in their hands. <sup>20</sup> Then the three companies blew the trumpets and broke the pitchers—they held the torches in their left hands and the trumpets in their right hands for blowing—and they cried, "The sword of the LORD and of Gideon!""(NKJV)

# **MORNING WATCH**

# **Exodus 14:23-25 New King James Version reads:**

"23 And the Egyptians pursued and went after them into the midst of the sea, all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen.

<sup>24</sup> Now it came to pass, <u>in the morning watch</u>, that the LORD looked down upon the army of the Egyptians through the pillar of fire and cloud, and He troubled the army of the Egyptians. <sup>25</sup> And He took off<sup>[a]</sup> their chariot wheels, so that they drove them with difficulty; and the Egyptians said, "Let us flee from the face of Israel, for the LORD fights for them against the Egyptians.""(NKJV)

A morning watch can also be found in 1 Samuel 11:11.

In the New Testament, watches were divided into fourths. We know there had to be a first watch, because there is a second, third, and fourth mentioned in the Bible.

# **SECOND AND THIRD**

# **Luke 12:37-39 New King James Version**

"37 Blessed *are* those servants whom the master, when he comes, will find watching. Assuredly, I say to you that he will gird himself and have them sit down *to eat*, and will come and serve them. <sup>38</sup> And if he should come in the second watch, or come in the third watch, and find *them* so, blessed are those servants. <sup>39</sup> But know this, that if the master of the house had known what hour the thief would come, he would have watched and [a] not allowed his house to be broken into."(NKJV)

# **FOURTH WATCH**

**Matthew 14:24-26 New King James Version** 

"24 But the boat was now in the middle of the sea, [a] tossed by the waves, for the wind was contrary.

<sup>25</sup> Now in the <u>fourth watch of the night</u> Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. <sup>26</sup> And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out for fear."(NKJV)



When watches were divided into fourths - a 12-hour period of NIGHT was also adjusted for the seasons of the year. In the winter, nights are longer and daylight is shorter. In the summer, nights are shorter and daylight is longer. Each "watch" would contain 3 "hours" each, but they WERE NOT 60-minute hours. Ancient humankind used OTHER MEASURING METHODS such as hour glasses and water clocks for THOSE hours as we said before.


In modern time keeping, WE count the days from midnight to midnight, but sometimes we refer to the light as "daytime", "daylight", or "during the day." Our combination of day and night – the whole 24-hour period is still called "a day."

When we compute time we use a different standard of measurement. We have a standard that sets a day as being 1,440 minutes long, no matter what time of the year it is. We divide that number by the standard of a 60-minute hour and we get a 24-hour day.


The hours on a sundial are different. They are based on a standard measurement of 12.

On a sunny day in the ancient world, time was kept using obelisks and sundials. A sundial measures time on a SUNNY day – during the daytime hours only - the time the sun is up. The sun rises in the East and moves to set in the West. The base of a sundial is circular and divided and marked into 12 parts numbered with numerals which make a shadow hour. A gnomon is in the center. At first a gnomon just consisted of a stick stuck into the ground. Later, it became an angular shape attached to a base which faced north creating greater accuracy. (Higgins et al., 2004 NIST)

Here is a sundial and it has marked increments or divisions and numerals around the outside edge. It has a gnomon in the center. I used a stick, just like they did in ancient time. It's pronounced ["nomon," the "g" is silent,] but it's spelled g-n-o-m-o-n like this: gnomon. When the sun would shine down on the gnomon, then it would cast a shadow and here we see a shadow in gray. Sometimes it would land in between the marked divisions, sometimes on the line, and in this case, it's on the 2.



Remember, the sun rises in the east and moves throughout the day until it sets in the west. Throughout the day, as the sun changes position in the sky it hits the gnomon and casts a shadow onto the marked divisions on the base which represent shadow hours. The length of a <a href="mailto:shadow">shadow</a> hour is <a href="mailto:different">different</a> than our 60-minute hours today, because shadow hours are based on <a href="mailto:sunlight">sunlight</a> alone. The length of the sun's <a href="mailto:shadow">shadow</a> hours change with the seasons. In summer, the sun's shadow hours are long. In winter, the sun's shadow hours are short. (Higgins et al., 2004 NIST)



#### **Sun Hours on a Sundial in Summer**

Let's suppose it's the first day of Summer - the <u>longest</u> day of the year.

Let's use as an example a 5:25 a.m. sunrise and an 8:30 p.m. sunset on a sundial.

That means there were 905 minutes of sunlight on a sundial that day. We're using our mathematical concepts to figure this out, but remember, ancient man didn't know how many seconds were in a minute, etc. Everything was approximate. Remember, the sun hours on a sundial would have been divided by 12 for the number of divisions on the sundial. 905 minutes of sunlight divided by twelve equals a sun hour that is 75.41 minutes long.

# **Sun Hours on a Sundial in Winter**

Let's suppose it's the first day of Winter – the shortest day of the year.

Let's use as an example a 7:16 a.m. sunrise and a 4:31 p.m. sunset on a sundial.

That means there were 555 minutes of sunlight on a sundial that day.

The sun hours on the sun dial on the first day of Winter would also have been divided by 12 for the number of divisions on the sundial. 555 minutes of sunlight divided by twelve equals a sun hour that is 46.25 minutes long. So you can see, the sun hours are longer in summer than in the winter on a sundial.

**Proof can be found in the Bible of sun dials being used:** 

#### 2 Kings 20:8-11 New King James Version (NKJV)

- "8 And Hezekiah said to Isaiah, "What is the sign that the LORD will heal me, and that I shall go up to the house of the LORD the third day?"
- <sup>9</sup> Then Isaiah said, "This is the sign to you from the LORD, that the LORD will do the thing which He has spoken: *shall* the shadow go forward ten degrees or go backward ten degrees?"
- "10 And Hezekiah answered, "It is an easy thing for the shadow to go down ten degrees; no, but let the shadow go backward ten degrees."
- <sup>11</sup> So Isaiah the prophet cried out to the LORD, and He brought the shadow ten degrees backward, by which it had gone down on the sundial of Ahaz."(NKJV)

# **Isaiah 38:7-8 New King James Version (NKJV) reads:**

"7 And this is the sign to you from the LORD, that the LORD will do this thing which He has spoken: 8 "Behold, I will bring the shadow on the sundial, which has gone down with the sun on the sundial of Ahaz, ten degrees backward." So the sun returned ten degrees on the dial by which it had gone down." (NKJV)

So, when the Bible says this in....

John 11:8-10 New International Version

"8 "But Rabbi," they said, "a short while ago the Jews there tried to stone you, and yet you are going back?"

<sup>9</sup> Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours of daylight? Anyone who walks in the daytime will not stumble, for they see by this world's light. <sup>10</sup> It is when a person walks at night that they stumble, for they have no light." (NIV)

Christ was speaking about the sun on a SUNDIAL. He was talking about <u>DAYLIGHT</u> - <u>NOT</u> A 24-HOUR DAY. A 24-hour day consists of day + night.

The Apostles did not yet fully understand what God was doing.

The Jews did not crucify Christ - essentially, Father God orchestrated His <u>own</u> Son's death to bring about the salvation of His people and to bring the promised Messiah. Had mankind not sinned – no sacrifice would have been necessary.

Twelve sun hours began once the sun was up. They were counted off by using ordinal numbers, first hour, second hour, third hour, etc. and they were approximate, so in the Bible the word "about" is used when mentioning an hour.

A <u>few</u> examples of the use of the word "hour" in the Bible:

"very hour"... Daniel 4:33 (NKJV)

"same hour"... Daniel 5:5 (NKJV)

3<sup>rd</sup> hour... Mark 15:25, Acts 2:15, Acts 23:23 (KJV)

6th hour ... Matthew 20:3, Matthew 20:5, Matthew 27:45, Mark 15:33, Luke 23:44, John 4:6,

John 19:14, Acts 10:9 (KJV)

7<sup>th</sup> hour..... John 4: 52 (KJV)

9<sup>th</sup> hour.... Matthew 20:5, Matthew 27:46, Mark 15:34, Acts 3:1, Acts 10:3, Acts 10:30 (KJV)

10<sup>th</sup> hour .... John 1:39 (KJV)

11th hour..... Matthew 20:6, Matthew 20:9 (KJV)

12<sup>th</sup> hour.... John 11: 8 – 10 This scripture mentions that there are twelve hours during daylight

on a sun dial (KJV)

They also used the cock's crow. Matthew 26:34, Matthew 26:74, Matthew 26:75, Mark 13:35, Mark 14:68, Mark 14:72, Luke 22:34, Luke 22:60 - 61, John 13:38, John 18:27 (KJV)

7<sup>th</sup> day of the week - To the Jews this was called the "Sabbath" prior to and after the crucifixion of Christ. AFTER Christ's Resurrection this is just the 7<sup>th</sup> day of the week for Christians. The FIRST day of the week became "the Lord's Day" for Christians. (Rev. 1:10 NKJV)

God's Word says the beginning of the sacred new year begins with the month Abib [Aveeve] in the Spring NOT in the Fall as has been taught incorrectly. On the fourteenth day of the month Abib [Aveeve] the Lord took the Hebrew people out of bondage to Pharaoh.

Christ also takes all mankind who will believe in Himout of bondage to Satan through Christ's death at Passover, His Entombment, His Resurrection, and through the baptism of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Some people have believed the lie that this calendar was changed when the Israelites were taken into captivity. This is NOT true and I can prove it to you.

In Ezekiel 40:1 New King James Version it states:

"40 In the twenty-fifth year of our captivity, at the beginning of the year, on the tenth day of the month, in the fourteenth year after the city was [a]captured, on the very same day the hand of the LORD was upon me; and He took me there." (NKJV)

You see, the Israelites WERE in captivity and it was the beginning of the year in the Spring NOT in the Fall of the year. You will see by the next scripture that they were instructed to observe the Passover, which we have already studied occurs in the first month of the year Abib [Aveeve], in the Spring NOT in the Fall. When we studied the months of the year, we DID see a reference for the name of the first month as "Nisan" (NKJV), but the SAME schedule was still being kept regardless of that fact. The beginning of the year was in the Spring.

In Ezekiel 45: 21 the Israelites were STILL in captivity and it STILL says the beginning of the Biblical year is in the SPRING NOT in the Fall as has been taught incorrectly. What are they celebrating? Passover, which I've already proven to you through the calendar (and will prove further through Exodus 12: 1 – 11 and Deuteronomy 16: 1) occurs in the SPRING in the first month of the year "Abib" (NKJV) pronounced [Aveeve] in the Hebrew.

**Ezekiel 45: 21 New King James Version reads:** 

"21 "In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month, you shall observe the Passover, a feast of seven days; unleavened bread shall be eaten." (NKJV)

What were the original instructions?

**Deuteronomy 16:1 New King James Version** 

"16 "Observe the month of Abib, and keep the Passover to the LORD your God, for in the month of Abib the LORD your God brought you out of Egypt by night." (NKJV)

The Israelites WERE celebrating the Passover at the correct TIME OF THE YEAR in the captivity, BUT they were STILL DISOBEYING IN ANOTHER WAY. Notice what Ezekiel says, "you shall observe the Passover, a feast of seven days; unleavened bread shall be eaten." (NKJV)

Those WERE NOT the requirements for the Feast of Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread. Originally, they were 2 SEPARATE DISTINCT FEASTS – COMBINED THEY LASTED 8 DAYS not 7.

The requirements for Passover then were the same as they were in Exodus 12: 1 – 11 and Deuteronomy 16: 1.

The celebration of Rosh Hashanah the so-called "Jewish New Year" in the Fall is a FALSE teaching.

Notice, time had transpired between when Christ was PLACED IN THE TOMB and when it was SEALED by an authority. Christ was placed in the tomb towards the end of the Passover and then the Feast of Unleavened Bread HAD ALREADY STARTED when the Chief Priests and Pharisees go to Pilate and want the tomb sealed and a watch set. (Matthew 27: 62-66) After the tomb is SEALED the 3-day count begins here! It WAS the starting point, because in order to fulfill the requirements for the Day of Atonement according to Leviticus 16:17, no one could enter the tomb.

Leviticus 16:17

"17 And there shall be no man in the tabernacle of the congregation when he goeth in to make an atonement in the holy place, until he come out, and have made an atonement for himself, and for his household, and for all the congregation of Israel."(KJV)

Until it WAS sealed there was no guarantee that Lev. 16:17 would be kept.

Christ said.

"40 For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth."

(Matthew 12:40 KJV)

Christ is Risen and notice the new day had already started after dark, so it WAS the day AFTER the Jewish sabbath or the 1<sup>st</sup> Day of the Week. In MODERN time keeping, part of it was a Saturday and part of it a Sunday.

The women don't come until the a.m. – after Christ is already risen. Remember, they think they are coming to anoint a dead body (Mark 16:1)

In order for the <u>MANDATORY</u> SEALING of the tomb (Lev. 16:17) to be the starting point for the 3-day count - 2 additional proofs HAD to be met. The Resurrection HAD to occur on the <u>THIRD DAY AND</u> IT HAD TO BE <u>THE DAY AFTER THE SABBATH</u>. The fact that it IS the day AFTER the Sabbath can be confirmed through Luke 24:1-13 when on the "first day of the week" (Luke 24:1) (the day after the Jewish sabbath) the women go to the tomb and find that Christ is missing from the tomb (NIV). The men walking to Emmaus confirm that it is the "same day" in verse 24:13 and in verse 24:21 it says: "...And what is more, it is <u>the third day</u> since all this **took place."** (NIV)

Christ fulfills All of the Old Testament Feasts: 50 days after the Resurrection is the Feast of Pentecost when the baptism of the Holy Spirit was given which fulfills the Feast of Weeks (Exodus 34:21-23). Christ WAS the First Fruit (1 Cor.15: 19 – 21)

So, what preceded the Passover where Christ was crucified in the New Testament?

The hyssop that was used to put the blood on the side posts prophesies of the hyssop and vinegar Christ was offered on the cross.

John 19:28-30 New King James Version (NKJV) reads:


"28 After this, Jesus, knowing<sup>[a]</sup> that all things were now accomplished, that the Scripture might be fulfilled, said, "I thirst!" <sup>29</sup> Now a vessel full of sour wine was sitting there; and they filled a sponge with sour wine, put *it* on hyssop, and put *it* to His mouth. <sup>30</sup> So when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said, "It is finished!" And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit." (NKJV)

In the Old Testament Passover, God was taking His people out of bondage to Pharaoh which was prophetic for how Christ would take all mankind out of bondage to Satan for all who will receive Christ as their Savior.

The Old Testament Passover lamb prophesied of Christ's death. God prophesied of Christ's cross through the blood of the lamb that the Israelites put on the two side posts and the lintel (the top center of the door.) The blood at the top prophesied of the blood from the crown of thorns that would be hammered into Christ's skull. The blood on the two side posts prophesied of the blood that would come from the nailing of his hands to the cross. The blood on the lintel would have dripped down onto the threshold of the door prophesying of the blood from Christ's feet being nailed to the base of the cross.

## Christ said,

Christ is the lamb without blemish, the unleavened bread, and the bitter herbs are prophetic for the bitter suffering on the cross He will endure. The Apostle Paul equated leaven with sin, because it is the impurities in grain that cause yeast organisms to form which make bread rise. The same is true when wine is made. The skins of the grapes also create organisms which create yeast and cause fermentation. Christ was WITHOUT impurities - WITHOUT leaven – He was sinless, so on that special night of Passover He served another meal as well. It was the last time Christ would celebrate the Passover with His Apostles so it is referred to as the Last Supper.

Passover BEGINS. No leaven was eaten on this day as well. (Exodus 12:8) The last supper. (Matthew 26:20 – 29)

This is ALSO the day of preparation Luke 23:54-56 for the Feast of Unleavened Bread – the next day no work could be done.

Christ served the Passover meal that night and He also served the first communion meal. He told His Apostles to do this in remembrance of Him. The bread was unleavened and the drink was unleavened too. It was from the fruit of the vine in the "cluster" – it was juice. (Isaiah 65:8 NKJV)

#### **Isaiah 65:8-9 New King James Version reads:**

"8 Thus says the LORD:

"As the new wine is found in the cluster, And one says, 'Do not destroy it, For a blessing is in it,' So will I do for My servants' sake, That I may not destroy them all.

9 I will bring forth descendants from Jacob, And from Judah an heir of My mountains; My elect shall inherit it, And My servants shall dwell there." (NKJV) You can read additional information about the Last Supper in the book of John.

When speaking about communion to his congregation the Apostle Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 5:6-8

"6 Your glorying *is* not good. Do you not know that a little leaven leavens the whole lump? <sup>7</sup> Therefore appurge out the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, since you truly are unleavened. For indeed Christ, our Passover, was sacrificed befor us. <sup>8</sup> Therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened *bread* of sincerity and truth." (1 Corinthians 5:6-8 NKJV)

Luke 22:14-23 also tells of this special evening. I read from the New King James Version (NKJV)

"14 When the hour had come, He sat down, and the [a]twelve apostles with Him. 15 Then He said to them, "With *fervent* desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; 16 for I say to you, I will no longer eat of it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God."

<sup>17</sup> Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, "Take this and divide *it* among yourselves; <sup>18</sup> for I say to you, <sup>[b]</sup>I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes."

<sup>19</sup> And He took bread, gave thanks and broke *it,* and gave *it* to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me."

<sup>20</sup> Likewise He also *took* the cup after supper, saying, "This cup *is* the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you. <sup>21</sup> But behold, the hand of My betrayer *is* with Me on the table. <sup>22</sup> And truly the Son of Man goes as it has been determined, but woe to that man by whom He is betrayed!"

<sup>23</sup> Then they began to question among themselves, which of them it was who would do this thing." (Luke 22:14-23 NKJV)

Remember all of this is occurring AFTER DARK.

Matthew 26:20-29 also tells of this special evening. I read from the New King James Version (NKJV)

- "20 When evening had come, He sat down with the twelve. 21 Now as they were eating, He said, "Assuredly, I say to you, one of you will betray Me."
- <sup>22</sup> And they were exceedingly sorrowful, and each of them began to say to Him, "Lord, is it I?"
- <sup>23</sup> He answered and said, "He who dipped *his* hand with Me in the dish will betray Me. <sup>24</sup> The Son of Man indeed goes just as it is written of Him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been good for that man if he had not been born."
- <sup>25</sup> Then Judas, who was betraying Him, answered and said, "Rabbi, is it !?"

He said to him, "You have said it."

- <sup>26</sup> And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, [a]blessed and broke *it*, and gave *it* to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is My body."

- <sup>33</sup> Peter answered and said to Him, "Even if all are [b] made to stumble because of You, I will never be made to stumble."
- <sup>34</sup> Jesus said to him, "Assuredly, I say to you that this night, before the rooster crows, you will deny Me three times."
- <sup>35</sup> Peter said to Him, "Even if I have to die with You, I will not deny You!"

And so said all the disciples." (NKJV)

In the next scripture the Apostles are falling asleep. Remember, this is all happening at night and the Apostles have been up all day. Now they are tired. They do not understand what is about to happen and the seriousness of the situation. Within Matthew 26: 36 – 68 Christ is taken captive.

#### Matthew 26:36-42 I read from the New King James Version (NKJV)

- "<sup>36</sup> Then Jesus came with them to a place called Gethsemane, and said to the disciples, "Sit here while I go and pray over there." <sup>37</sup> And He took with Him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and He began to be sorrowful and deeply distressed. <sup>38</sup> Then He said to them, "My soul is exceedingly sorrowful, even to death. Stay here and watch with Me."
- <sup>39</sup> He went a little farther and fell on His face, and prayed, saying, "O My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will."
- <sup>40</sup> Then He came to the disciples and found them sleeping, and said to Peter, "What! Could you not watch with Me one hour? <sup>41</sup> Watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation. The spirit indeed *is* willing, but the flesh *is* weak."
- <sup>42</sup> Again, a second time, He went away and prayed, saying, "O My Father, [a] if this cup cannot pass away from Me unless I drink it, Your will be done." <sup>43</sup> And He came and found them asleep again, for their eyes were heavy."(NKJV)

Remember, this is all happening AT NIGHT and the Apostles have been awake all day. They are tired and are falling asleep.

#### **Matthew 26:44 - 56 I read from the New King James Version (NKJV)**

- "44 So He left them, went away again, and prayed the third time, saying the same words. 45 Then He came to His disciples and said to them, "Are you still sleeping and resting? Behold, the hour [b] is at hand, and the Son of Man is being betrayed into the hands of sinners. 46 Rise, let us be going. See, My betrayer is at hand."
- <sup>47</sup> And while He was still speaking, behold, Judas, one of the twelve, with a great multitude with swords and clubs, came from the chief priests and elders of the people.
- <sup>48</sup> Now His betrayer had given them a sign, saying, "Whomever I kiss, He is the One; seize Him." <sup>49</sup> Immediately he went up to Jesus and said, "Greetings, Rabbi!" and kissed Him.
- <sup>50</sup> But Jesus said to him, "Friend, why have you come?"
- Then they came and laid hands on Jesus and took Him. <sup>51</sup> And suddenly, one of those *who were* with Jesus stretched out *his* hand and drew his sword, struck the servant of the high priest, and cut off his ear.
- <sup>52</sup> But Jesus said to him, "Put your sword in its place, for all who take the sword will <sup>[5]</sup>perish by the sword. <sup>53</sup> Or do you think that I cannot now pray to My Father, and He will provide Me with more than twelve legions of angels? <sup>54</sup> How then could the Scriptures be fulfilled, that it must happen thus?"
- <sup>55</sup> In that hour Jesus said to the multitudes, "Have you come out, as against a robber, with swords and clubs to take Me? I sat daily with you, teaching in the temple, and you did not seize Me. <sup>56</sup> But all this was done that the Scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled."

Then all the disciples forsook Him and fled." (NKJV)

In the book of Luke, we learn that when one of Christ's servants had cut off the right ear of the high priest - Christ healed him and reattached it to his head.

## **Luke 22:47-51 New King James Version reads:**

- "47 And while He was still speaking, behold, a multitude; and he who was called Judas, one of the twelve, went before them and drew near to Jesus to kiss Him. 48 But Jesus said to him, "Judas, are you betraying the Son of Man with a kiss?"
- <sup>49</sup> When those around Him saw what was going to happen, they said to Him, "Lord, shall we strike with the sword?" <sup>50</sup> And one of them struck the servant of the high priest and cut off his right ear.
- <sup>51</sup> But Jesus answered and said, "Permit even this." And He touched his ear and healed him." (NKJV)

Notice, that even though Christ had performed this miracle BEFORE they took Him away, they still doubted that He was the Son of God.

#### Matthew 26:57-68 I read from the New King James Version (NKJV)

- "57 And those who had laid hold of Jesus led *Him* away to Caiaphas the high priest, where the scribes and the elders were assembled. 58 But Peter followed Him at a distance to the high priest's courtyard. And he went in and sat with the servants to see the end.
- <sup>59</sup> Now the chief priests, <sup>[d]</sup>the elders, and all the council sought false testimony against Jesus to put Him to death, <sup>60</sup> <sup>[e]</sup>but found none. Even though many false witnesses came forward, they found none. But at last two <sup>[f]</sup>false witnesses came forward <sup>61</sup> and said, "This *fellow* said, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God and to build it in three days.'"
- <sup>62</sup> And the high priest arose and said to Him, "Do You answer nothing? What *is it* these men testify against You?" <sup>63</sup> But Jesus kept silent. And the high priest answered and said to Him, "I put You under oath by the living God: Tell us if You are the Christ, the Son of God!"
- <sup>64</sup> Jesus said to him, "It is as you said. Nevertheless, I say to you, hereafter you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Power, and coming on the clouds of heaven."
- <sup>65</sup> Then the high priest tore his clothes, saying, "He has spoken blasphemy! What further need do we have of witnesses? Look, now you have heard His blasphemy! <sup>66</sup> What do you think?"

They answered and said, "He is deserving of death."

<sup>67</sup> Then they spat in His face and beat Him; and others struck *Him* with <sup>[g]</sup>the palms of their hands, <sup>68</sup> saying, "Prophesy to us, Christ! Who is the one who struck You?"" (NKJV)

Notice, time had transpired between when Christ was PLACED IN THE TOMB and when it was SEALED by an authority. Christ was placed in the tomb towards the end of the Passover and then the Feast of Unleavened Bread HAD ALREADY STARTED when the Chief Priests and Pharisees go to Pilate and want the tomb sealed and a watch set. (Matthew 27: 62-66) After the tomb is SEALED the 3-day count begins here! It WAS the starting point, because in order to fulfill the requirements for the Day of Atonement according to Leviticus 16:17, no one could enter the tomb.

Leviticus 16:17

"17 And there shall be no man in the tabernacle of the congregation when he goeth in to make an atonement in the holy place, until he come out, and have made an atonement for himself, and for his household, and for all the congregation of Israel."(KJV)

Until it WAS sealed there was no guarantee that Lev. 16:17 would be kept.

Christ said.

"40 For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth."

(Matthew 12:40 KJV)

Christ is Risen and notice the new day had already started after dark, so it WAS the day AFTER the Jewish sabbath or the 1<sup>st</sup> Day of the Week. In MODERN time keeping, part of it was a Saturday and part of it a Sunday.

The women don't come until the a.m. – after Christ is already risen. Remember, they think they are coming to anoint a dead body (Mark 16:1)

In order for the <u>MANDATORY</u> SEALING of the tomb (Lev. 16:17) to be the starting point for the 3-day count - 2 additional proofs HAD to be met. The Resurrection HAD to occur on the <u>THIRD DAY AND</u> IT HAD TO BE <u>THE DAY AFTER THE SABBATH</u>. The fact that it IS the day AFTER the Sabbath can be confirmed through Luke 24:1-13 when on the "first day of the week" (Luke 24:1) (the day after the Jewish sabbath) the women go to the tomb and find that Christ is missing from the tomb (NIV). The men walking to Emmaus confirm that it is the "same day" in verse 24:13 and in verse 24:21 it says: "...And what is more, it is <u>the third day</u> since all this **took place."** (NIV)

Christ fulfills All of the Old Testament Feasts: 50 days after the Resurrection is the Feast of Pentecost when the baptism of the Holy Spirit was given which fulfills the Feast of Weeks (Exodus 34:21-23). Christ WAS the First Fruit (1 Cor.15: 19 – 21)

The Feast of Tabernacles was also fulfilled, because of the in-dwelling of Christ and the Holy Spirit within us. (Luke 17: 20-22) Christ IS the trumpet for the Feast of Trumpets (1 Thess. 4:16 & Rev.1:10 – 19), Christ was our Atonement – (Romans 3: 24 - 26, Hebrews 2:16-18) and still more. ## Matthew 26:69-75 reads in the New King James Version (NKJV)

- "69 Now Peter sat outside in the courtyard. And a servant girl came to him, saying, "You also were with Jesus of Galilee."
- <sup>70</sup> But he denied it before them all, saying, "I do not know what you are saying."
- <sup>71</sup> And when he had gone out to the gateway, another *girl* saw him and said to those *who were* there, "This *fellow* also was with Jesus of Nazareth."
- <sup>72</sup> But again he denied with an oath, "I do not know the Man!"
- <sup>73</sup> And a little later those who stood by came up and said to Peter, "Surely you also are *one* of them, for your speech betrays you."
- <sup>74</sup> Then he began to <sup>[a]</sup>curse and <sup>[b]</sup>swear, *saying*, "I do not know the Man!" Immediately a rooster crowed. <sup>75</sup> And Peter remembered the word of Jesus who had said to him, "Before the rooster crows, you will deny Me three times." So he went out and wept bitterly." (NKJV)

#### Why did Peter deny the Christ?

He was afraid for his life. The Lord knew He would do this, but he wasn't alone – all of the Apostles ran. The Lord also knew that Peter would repent and be restored to his leadership position, because before the Passover ever occurs Christ assigns Peter the task of leading His church.

Matthew 16:13-18 in the New King James Version (NKJV) reads:

<sup>&</sup>quot;13 When Jesus came into the region of Caesarea Philippi, He asked His disciples, saying, "Who do men say that I, the Son of Man, am?"

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>14</sup> So they said, "Some say John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets."

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>15</sup> He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?"

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>16</sup> Simon Peter answered and said, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>17</sup> Jesus answered and said to him, "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah, for flesh and blood has not revealed *this* to you, but My Father who is in heaven. <sup>18</sup> And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not [a] prevail against it." (NKJV)

I want to emphasize again, essentially, Father God orchestrated His own Son's death as a human being, so that Christ's death and blood sacrifice on the cross would fulfill all of the blood sacrifices required in the Old Testament once and for all to bring about the salvation of His people and to bring the promised Messiah.

# John 3:16-17 New King James Version reads:

"16 For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. 17 For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved." (NKJV)

And this is the name by which it will be called: 'The LORD is our righteousness.'"(ESV)

This is only one of the many scriptures that prophesy of Christ's crucifixion and the reason He was sent to die on the cross.

#### **Isaiah 53:1-4 New International Version (NIV)**

- "53 Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?
- <sup>2</sup> He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground.
- He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him.
- <sup>3</sup> He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain.
- Like one from whom people hide their faces he was despised, and we held him in low esteem.
- <sup>4</sup> Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted." (NIV)

#### **Isaiah 53:5-8 New International Version (NIV)**

"5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed. <sup>6</sup> We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all. <sup>7</sup> He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. <sup>8</sup> By oppression<sup>[a]</sup> and judgment he was taken away. Yet who of his generation protested? For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people he was punished. [b]" (NIV)

## **Isaiah 53:9-12 New International Version (NIV)**

- "9 He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death, though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth.
- <sup>10</sup> Yet it was the LORD's will to crush him and cause him to suffer, and though the LORD makes<sup>[a]</sup> his life an offering for sin, he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the LORD will prosper in his hand.
- 11 After he has suffered, he will see the light of life[b] and be satisfied[c]; by his knowledge[d] my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities.
- 12 Therefore I will give him a portion among the great, [e] and he will divide the spoils with the strong, [f] because he poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors.

  For he bore the sin of many,

and made intercession for the transgressors." (NIV)

Christ endured the crown of thorns pounded into his head, Roman scourging (whipping and tearing of the flesh until near death), the pounding of nails into his hands and feet, hanging from those nails and the tearing of human flesh because of the hanging weight of His body - surely this would have caused such edema of tissue that He would indeed be unrecognizable. The scriptures prophesy that Christ would be beaten beyond recognition.

Isaiah 52:13-15 New International Version (NIV)

- "13 See, my servant will act wisely[a]; he will be raised and lifted up and highly exalted.
- <sup>14</sup> Just as there were many who were appalled at him<sup>[b]</sup>— his appearance was so disfigured beyond that of any human being and his form marred beyond human likeness—
- 15 so he will sprinkle many nations, [c] and kings will shut their mouths because of him.

For what they were not told, they will see, and what they have not heard, they will understand."(NIV)

That word "sprinkle" in Isaiah 52: 15 (ESV) is referring to sprinkled blood, because the priests in the Old Testament were instructed to sprinkle the blood of the Old Testament sacrifices: before the veil of the sanctuary (Lev. 4:6 and Lev. 4:17), on the side of the altar (Lev. 5:9), on the priests garments (Lev. 8:30), on the mercy seat (Lev.16:14), on the front of the tent of meeting (Numbers 19:4), and on the tent and all its furnishings (Numbers 19:18).

#### THESE NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES BELOW ARE SPEAKING ABOUT THE OLD COVENANT:

**Hebrews 9:18-20 English Standard Version** 

"18 Therefore not even the first covenant was inaugurated without blood. <sup>19</sup> For when every commandment of the law had been declared by Moses to all the people, he took the blood of calves and goats, with water and scarlet wool and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book itself and all the people, <sup>20</sup> saying, "This is the blood of the covenant that God commanded for you."" (ESV)

THE SCRIPTURES BELOW SHOW THE FULFILLMENT OF THE OLD TESTAMENT SACRIFICE REQUIREMENTS ONCE AND FOR ALL THROUGH CHRIST'S SHED BLOOD ON THE CROSS.

**Hebrews 12:22-24 English Standard Version** 

"22 But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, 23 and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, 24 and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel." (ESV)

These scriptures prophesied that Christ's legs would not be broken:

**Exodus 12:46 New International Version (NIV)** 

"46 "It must be eaten inside the house; take none of the meat outside the house. Do not break any of the bones." (NIV)

**Numbers 9:12 New International Version (NIV) reads:** 

"12 They must not leave any of it till morning or break any of its bones. When they celebrate the Passover, they must follow all the regulations." (NIV)

Psalm 34:20 also prophesies that Christ's legs would not be broken on the cross.

**Psalm 34:20 New International Version (NIV) reads:** 

"20 he protects all his bones, not one of them will be broken." (NIV)

This scripture prophesies of the piercing of Christ's side:

**Zechariah 12:10 New International Version (NIV)** 

"10 "And I will pour out on the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem a spirit<sup>[a]</sup> of grace and supplication. They will look on<sup>[b]</sup> me, the one they have pierced, and they will mourn for him as one mourns for an only child, and grieve bitterly for him as one grieves for a firstborn son." (NIV)

## Psalm 22: 16 – 18 New American Standard Bible

- "16 For dogs have surrounded me;
- [n] A band of evildoers has encompassed me;
- They pierced my hands and my feet.
- <sup>17</sup> I can count all my bones.
- They look, they stare at me;
- 18 They divide my garments among them,

And they cast lots for my clothing." (NASB)

#### Remember, this is STILL the Passover.

In Matthew 27: 1 - 12 we read about how Christ's crucifixion came about.

"27 When morning came, all the chief priests and elders of the people plotted against Jesus to put Him to death. <sup>2</sup> And when they had bound Him, they led Him away and delivered Him to [a]Pontius Pilate the governor.

<sup>3</sup> Then Judas, His betrayer, seeing that He had been condemned, was remorseful and brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders, <sup>4</sup> saying, "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood."

# CHRIST WAS PUT IN THE TOMB BEFORE DARK ON PASSOVER.

HE DOES SUCCEED IN BRINGING ALL OF THEM TO COMPLETION!

The entombment IS NOT the starting point for the 3 days, because that would take us to the Jewish Sabbath and we know that the Resurrection did not occur then. If we were to go by when He is placed in the tomb and He's put in the tomb just before dark on the Passover — then the first day and every other day has to end just before dark. That DOES NOT WORK, because it brings us to the Jewish Sabbath and we know that Christ was risen on the first day of the week, so that CAN'T be correct. In fact, He HAD to be resurrected on the first day of the week to fulfill Leviticus 16:17 and STILL EVEN MORE SCRIPTURES and you will be shown why.

Now, look at the chart and count from the sealing of the tomb. Since He was sealed in the tomb just AFTER dark - then when we count the 3 days – the end of each day has to be AFTER dark. So, follow the yellow section on the chart to count the days. You see, it brings us to the day AFTER the Jewish Sabbath or the first day of the week which IS correct.

In order for the MANDATORY SEALING of the tomb (Lev. 16:17) to be the starting point for the 3-day count - 2 additional proofs HAD to be met. The Resurrection HAD to occur on the THIRD DAY AND IT HAD TO BE THE DAY AFTER THE SABBATH. The fact that it IS the day AFTER the Sabbath can be confirmed through Luke 24:1-13 when on the "first day of the week" (Luke 24:1) (the day after the Jewish sabbath) the women go to the tomb and find that Christ is missing from the tomb (NIV). The men walking to Emmaus confirm that it is the "same day" in verse 24:13 and in verse 24:21 it says: "...And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place." (NIV)

Now, BEFORE I show you the Book of Luke, the Book of Matthew chapter 28:1 gives us some additional information as to what happens on the day AFTER the Sabbath while the women ARE ON THE WAY to the tomb. I'm going to PROVE that it was the day after the sabbath that Christ was risen and actually there were multiple trips to the tomb by particular people.

**Matthew 28:1 New International Version** 

"28 After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb." (NIV)

In the Book of Mark, it is revealed that on the way to the tomb the women have no idea who is going to roll the stone away. We're talking about a huge boulder large enough to cover a large hole made of very heavy rock.

Mark 16:1-3 New International Version

"16 When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. <sup>2</sup> Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb <sup>3</sup> and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?"" (NIV)

The book of Matthew tells us what happens NEXT - AS THE WOMEN ARE ON THE WAY.

#### Matthew 28: 1 – 4 New International Version reads:

"After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb. <sup>2</sup> There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. <sup>3</sup> His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow. <sup>4</sup> The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men." (NIV)

We know that the violent earthquake does not occur BEFORE the women leave from their homes, because there is no mention of it in another scripture. That means that the earthquake occurred while they were on the way. We know from the books of Luke 24:1-2, Matthew 28:1-4, Mark 16:4, and John 20:1 that the stone had already been rolled away by the time the women get there.

So, the ONLY EYEWITNESSES to this were the guards who were guarding the tomb. Notice the scripture says they became "like dead men." (NIV) That word "like" (Matthew 28: 4 NIV) is used as a simile – a comparison being made with the words "like" or "as." So, the men ARE NOT ACTUALLY DEAD they are laying there on the ground AS IF THEY WERE DEAD.

Notice, there was an earthquake to announce Christ's death <u>AFTER</u> HE DIED ON THE CROSS and there was an earthquake to ANNOUNCE HIS RESURRECTION ALSO <u>AFTER</u> HE WAS RESURRECTED ON THE DAY AFTER THE <u>JEWISH SABBATH</u>. IT OCCURS SOME TIME <u>BEFORE</u> THE WOMEN COME TO THE TOMB. God is getting the people's attention, and He is consistent!

#### **Luke 24:1-8 New International Version reads:**

"24 On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. <sup>2</sup> They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, <sup>3</sup> but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. <sup>4</sup> While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. <sup>5</sup> In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? <sup>6</sup> He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: <sup>7</sup> 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' Now I have told you."

<sup>8</sup> So the women hurried away from the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. <sup>9</sup> Suddenly Jesus met them. "Greetings," he said. They came to him, clasped his feet and worshiped him. <sup>10</sup> Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me." (NIV)

The women come to the tomb and do not find His body. Then they go back to tell the other disciples and return to the tomb with them.

Christ fulfilled the Passover, the Feast of Unleavened Bread, the Day of Atonement and He still fulfills even more through His Resurrection, and even beyond through the Baptism of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Christ HAD to be resurrected on the day after the Sabbath or the first day of the week to fulfill even more Old Testament scriptures.

# **Christ is our Passover**

1 Corinthians 5:7 New King James Version (NKJV) reads:

"7 Therefore purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, since you truly are unleavened. For indeed Christ, our Passover, was sacrificed for us. [a]"(NKJV)

Yeast is created by the impurities in the flour/grain. The Apostle Paul equated yeast/leaven with sin. Christ was "unleavened" or sinless. (NKJV) In this scripture, the Apostle Paul urges us to be without leaven or sinless the same way Christ was. Christ was our Passover lamb when He died on the cross for the sins of all mankind who will receive Him as their Savior.

# **Leviticus 23: 6 – 8 New King James Version reads:**

<sup>6</sup> And on the fifteenth day of the same month *is* the Feast of Unleavened Bread to the LORD; seven days you must eat unleavened bread. <sup>7</sup> On the first day you shall have a holy convocation; you shall do no <sup>[a]</sup>customary work on it. <sup>8</sup> But you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD for seven days. The seventh day *shall be* a holy convocation; you shall do no customary work *on it.* "" (NKJV)

Christ IS the Unleavened bread for Passover at His crucifixion and Christ IS the Unleavened bread for the Feast of Unleavened Bread during his entombment. He is also the Unleavened bread for the feast of Communion.

1 Corinthians 5:7-8 New King James Version (NKJV) reads:

"7 Therefore purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, since you truly are unleavened. For indeed Christ, our Passover, was sacrificed for us.[a]

<sup>8</sup>Therefore let us keep the feast, not with old leaven, nor with the leaven of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened *bread* of sincerity and truth." (NKJV)

That scripture means getting rid of sin in your life in order to stay in fellowship with Christ and to prepare for the feast of communion when IN fellowship. If a person is WILLFULLY sinning against Father God, the Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit and they KNOW they are doing it - then they are following the devil – NOT CHRIST. They are living in wickedness NOT TRUTH. This would also be taking Communion in an "unworthy manner" according to 1 Corinthians 11:27 (NKJV)

John 6:35 New King James Version (NKJV) reads:

"35 And Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life. He who comes to Me shall never hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst." (NKJV)

## The Old Testament in

**Leviticus 23: 9 – 14 New King James Version says...** 

"9 And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, 10 "Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them: 'When you come into the land which I give to you, and reap its harvest, then you shall bring a sheaf of the firstfruits of your harvest to the priest. 11 He shall wave the sheaf before the LORD, to be accepted on your behalf; on the day after the Sabbath the priest shall wave it. 12 And you shall offer on that day, when you wave the sheaf, a male lamb of the first year, without blemish, as a burnt offering to the LORD. 13 Its grain offering shall be two-tenths of an ephah of fine flour mixed with oil, an offering made by fire to the LORD, for a [b] sweet aroma; and its drink offering shall be of wine, one-fourth of a hin. 14 You shall eat neither bread nor parched grain nor fresh grain until the same day that you have brought an offering to your God; it shall be a statute forever throughout your generations in all your dwellings." Christ WAS the sheaf and First Fruit offering that fulfilled that Old Testament requirement at His Resurrection on the Day after the Sabbath.

1 Corinthians 15:20-21 New King James Version (NKJV)

"20 But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. 21 For since by man came death, by Man also came the resurrection of the dead." (NKJV)

**CHRIST IS THE SHEAF FOR THE FIRST FRUIT** OFFERING ACCORDING TO LEVITICUS 23: 9 -14 AT HIS RESURRECTION AND THIS BEGINS THE 50 DAY COUNT TO PENTECOST, SO THE FEAST OF WEEKS IS FULFILLED BY THE **BAPTISM OF THE HOLY SPIRIT AT** PENTECOST.

# **Leviticus 23: 15 – 22 New King James Version – The Feast of Weeks**

"15 'And you shall count for yourselves from the day after the Sabbath, from the day that you brought the sheaf of the wave offering: seven Sabbaths shall be completed. 16 Count fifty days to the day after the seventh Sabbath; then you shall offer a new grain offering to the LORD. 17 You shall bring from your dwellings two wave *loaves* of two-tenths of an ephah. They shall be of fine flour; they shall be baked with leaven. They are the firstfruits to the LORD. 18 And you shall offer with the bread seven lambs of the first year, without blemish, one young bull, and two rams. They shall be as a burnt offering to the LORD, with their grain offering and their drink offerings, an offering made by fire for a sweet aroma to the LORD. 19 Then you shall sacrifice one kid of the goats as a sin offering, and two male lambs of the first year as a sacrifice of a peace offering. <sup>20</sup> The priest shall wave them with the bread of the firstfruits as a wave offering before the LORD, with the two lambs. In the Old Testament, God instructed His people to make the Tabernacle, the Ark of the Covenant, and a Mercy Seat where He would meet with them.

# **Exodus 25:1-9 New King James Version reads:**

"25 Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying: <sup>2</sup> "Speak to the children of Israel, that they bring Me an offering. From everyone who gives it willingly with his heart you shall take My offering. <sup>3</sup> And this *is* the offering which you shall take from them: gold, silver, and bronze; <sup>4</sup> blue, purple, and scarlet *thread*, fine linen, and goats' *hair*; <sup>5</sup> ram skins dyed red, badger skins, and acacia wood; <sup>6</sup> oil for the light, and spices for the anointing oil and for the sweet incense; <sup>7</sup> onyx stones, and stones to be set in the ephod and in the breastplate. <sup>8</sup> And let them make Me a sanctuary, that I may dwell among them. <sup>9</sup> According to all that I show you, *that is*, the pattern of the tabernacle and the pattern of all its furnishings, just so you shall make *it*."(NKJV)

## **Exodus 25:10-22 New King James Version**

"10 "And they shall make an ark of acacia wood; two and a half cubits shall be its length, a cubit and a half its width, and a cubit and a half its height. <sup>11</sup> And you shall overlay it with pure gold, inside and out you shall overlay it, and shall make on it a molding of gold all around. <sup>12</sup> You shall cast four rings of gold for it, and put them in its four corners; two rings shall be on one side, and two rings on the other side. <sup>13</sup> And you shall make poles of acacia wood, and overlay them with gold. <sup>14</sup> You shall put the poles into the rings on the sides of the ark, that the ark may be carried by them. <sup>15</sup> The poles shall be in the rings of the ark; they shall not be taken from it. <sup>16</sup> And you shall put into the ark the Testimony which I will give you.

17 "You shall make a mercy seat of pure gold; two and a half cubits shall be its length and a cubit and a half its width. 18 And you shall make two cherubim of gold; of hammered work you shall make them at the two ends of the mercy seat. 19 Make one cherub at one end, and the other cherub at the other end; you shall make the cherubim at the two ends of it of one piece with the mercy seat. 20 And the cherubim shall stretch out their wings above, covering the mercy seat with their wings, and they shall face one another; the faces of the cherubim shall be toward the mercy seat. 21 You shall put the mercy seat on top of the ark, and in the ark you shall put the Testimony that I will give you. 22 And there I will meet with you, and I will speak with you from above the mercy seat, from between the two cherubim which are on the ark of the Testimony, about everything which I will give you in commandment to the children of Israel."(NKJV)

Christ IS the Ark and the Mercy Seat in the New Testament. God created them through Christ Himself in that tomb which was a temporary Tabernacle.

John 20:11-13 New International Version reads:

"11 Now Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb 12 and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot.

<sup>13</sup> They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?"

"They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put him."" (NIV)

# That's because He was already risen!

Notice how the angels are positioned where Christ had been laid. They are positioned the same way they were positioned on the Mercy Seat that had covered the Ark in the Old Testament. That's because CHRIST IS THE MERCY SEAT IN THE NEW TESTAMENT.

"26 And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying: 27 "Also the tenth day of this seventh month shall be the Day of Atonement. It shall be a holy convocation for you; you shall afflict your souls, and offer an offering made by fire to the LORD. <sup>28</sup> And you shall do no work on that same day, for it is the Day of Atonement, to make atonement for you before the LORD your God. <sup>29</sup> For any person who is not afflicted in soul on that same day shall be cut off from his people. 30 And any person who does any work on that same day, that person I will destroy from among his people. <sup>31</sup> You shall do no manner of work; it shall be a statute forever throughout your generations in all your dwellings. 32 It shall be to you a sabbath of solemn rest, and you shall [c]afflict your souls; on the ninth day of the month at evening, from evening to evening, you shall [d]celebrate your sabbath."" (NKJV)

CHRIST <u>WAS</u> and <u>IS</u> the ATONEMENT for all mankind who will receive Him as their Savior:

**Romans 3:24-26 New International Version reads:** 

"24 and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. 25 God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, all through the shedding of his blood—to be received by faith. He did this to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished—26 he did it to demonstrate his righteousness at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus."(NIV)

# **Hebrews 2:16-18 New International Version**

"16 For surely it is not angels he helps, but Abraham's descendants. 17 For this reason he had to be made like them, [a] fully human in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. 18 Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted." (NIV)

AGAIN, CHRIST IS THE SHEAF FOR THE FIRST FRUIT OFFERING ACCORDING TO LEVITICUS 23: 9 - 14 AT HIS RESURRECTION AND THIS BEGINS THE 50 DAY COUNT TO PENTECOST, SO THE FEAST OF WEEKS IS FULFILLED BY THE BAPTISM OF THE HOLY SPIRIT AT PENTECOST.

## The Feast of Pentecost fulfills the Feast of Weeks

50 days after Christ's Resurrection which took place on the first day of the week is the Feast of Pentecost when the baptism of the Holy Spirit was given which fulfills the Feast of Weeks (Leviticus 23: 15 – 22) ALSO on the first day of the week. (Exodus 34:21-23) (Acts 2)

Christ fulfills this by saving and bringing in a harvest of souls for His Father. The Holy Spirit will be their guide.

In the Old Testament, the Prophet Joel prophesies concerning things that actually occur in Acts 2 in the New Testament concerning the Baptism of the Holy Spirit. He also includes things that will occur later.

### Joel 2: 28 – 32 New American Standard Bible reads:

That I will come about after this
That I will pour out My Spirit on all [5] mankind;
And your sons and your daughters will prophesy,
Your old men will have dreams,
Your young men will see visions.

29 And even on the male and female servants
I will pour out My Spirit in those days.

30 I will [1] display wonders in the sky and on the earth, Blood, fire, and columns of smoke.
31 The sun will be turned into darkness, And the moon into blood, Before the great and awesome day of the LORD comes.
32 And it will come about that everyone who calls on the name of the LORD Will [1] be saved; For on Mount Zion and in Jerusalem There will be those who escape, Just as the LORD has said, Even among the survivors whom the LORD calls." (NASB)

In order for the MANDATORY SEALING of the tomb (Lev. 16:17) to be the starting point for the 3-day count - 2 additional proofs HAD to be met. The Resurrection HAD to occur on the THIRD DAY AND IT HAD TO BE THE DAY AFTER THE SABBATH. The fact that it IS the day AFTER the Sabbath can be confirmed through Luke 24:1-13 when on the "first day of the week" (Luke 24:1) (the day after the Jewish sabbath) the women go to the tomb and find that Christ is missing from the tomb (NIV). The men walking to Emmaus confirm that it is the "same day" in verse 24:13 and in verse 24:21 it says: "...And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place." (NIV)

Christ fulfills All of the Old Testament Feasts: 50 days after the Resurrection is the Feast of Pentecost when the baptism of the Holy Spirit was given which fulfills the Feast of Weeks (Exodus 34:21-23). Christ WAS the First Fruit (1 Cor.15: 19 - 21)

The Feast of Tabernacles was also fulfilled, because of the in-dwelling of Christ and the Holy Spirit within us. (Luke 17: 20-22) Christ IS the trumpet for the Feast of Trumpets (1 Thess. 4:16 & Rev.1:10 - 19), Christ was our Atonement - (Romans 3: 24 - 26, Hebrews 2:16-18) and still more. Notice, that in the original diagram it shows that Christ HAD to be risen just AFTER dark to fulfill the 3 DAY COUNT. THIS WAS THE FIRST WATCH OF THE NIGHT. NOW AT THE TIME THAT THE HOLY SPIRIT FULFILLS THE FEAST OF PENTECOST **EXACTLY 50 DAYS LATER IS FURTHER PROOF** THAT THE ACTUAL RESURRECTION DID OCCUR THEN! HOW? YOU'LL SEE!

When did the day of Pentecost come? AFTER DARK WHEN A NEW DAY WOULD BEGIN! NOTICE, THEY ARE IN A "HOUSE". (NASB) That word can mean an actual "house" or any building whatsoever.

- 1. an inhabited house, home
- 2. any building whatever" (Strong's G3624, BLB.org)

### Acts 2:1-13 New American Standard Bible

"2 When the day of Pentecost [a]had come, they were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup> And suddenly a noise like a violent rushing wind came from heaven, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup> And tongues that looked like fire appeared to them, [b] distributing themselves, and a tongue [c] rested on each one of them. <sup>4</sup> And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with different [d] tongues, as the Spirit was giving them the ability to speak out.

bothers were Jews residing in Jerusalem, devout men from every nation under heaven. And when this sound occurred, the crowd came together and they were bewildered, because each one of them was hearing them speak in his own [e]language. They were amazed and astonished, saying, "[f]Why, are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we each hear them in our own [g]language [h]to which we were born? Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea, and Cappadocia, Pontus and [j]Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya around Cyrene, and [j]visitors from Rome, both Jews and [k]proselytes, 1 Cretans and Arabs—we hear them speaking in our own [j]tongues of the mighty deeds of God." And they all continued in amazement and great perplexity, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others were jeering and saying, "They are full of [m]sweet wine!"" (NASB)

We've already learned that in ancient time keeping, for hours of DAYLIGHT - sundials were used and a standard of 12 was used for those daylight hours. They WERE NOT 60-minute hours. We also know that the night time was divided into fourths, and they were called "watches." This scripture in Acts 2:1 INDIRECTLY tells us that it is NIGHT, because we know that the beginning of the biblical day occurs at darkness when a sundial COULD NOT BE USED. This reference to "day" means the overall day – the whole 24-hour period NOT just the daylight hours.

The scripture shown below is at the BEGINNING of the day — at darkness!

AT THIS TIME, I COULD FIND ONLY 2 OTHER SCRIPTURES THAT REFER TO A NIGHT "HOUR": Acts 2: 15 <u>DUE TO</u>

THE CONTEXT IN WHICH IT OCCURS and Acts 23: 23, <u>BUT REMEMBER</u>, EVERY REFERENCE IN SCRIPTURE THAT REFERS TO

WHEN A NEW DAY BEGINS — IS OCCURRING AT DARKNESS.

#### **Acts 23:23 New American Standard Bible**

<sup>"23</sup> And he called to him two of the centurions and said, "Get two hundred soldiers ready by [a]the third hour of the night to proceed to Caesarea, [b] with seventy horsemen and two hundred [c]spearmen."" (NASB)



When watches were divided into fourths - a 12-hour period of NIGHT was also adjusted for the seasons of the year. In the winter, nights are longer and daylight is shorter. In the summer, nights are shorter and daylight is longer. Each "watch" would contain 3 "hours" each, but they WERE NOT 60-minute hours. Ancient humankind used OTHER MEASURING METHODS such as hour glasses and water clocks for THOSE hours as we said before.

#### This means that WHEN PENTECOST AND THE OUTPOURING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT CAME IN:





### THE COUNT WORKS GOING FORWARDS AND BACKWARDS!





### **Acts 2:14-21 New American Standard Bible**

"14 But Peter, taking his stand with the *other* eleven, raised his voice and declared to them: "Men of Judea and all you who live in Jerusalem, [a]know this, and pay attention to my words. 15 For these people are not drunk, as you assume, since it is *only* the [b]third hour of the day; 16 but this is what has been spoken through the prophet Joel:

<sup>43</sup> [d] Everyone kept feeling a sense of awe; and many wonders and [e] signs were taking place through the apostles. <sup>44</sup> And all the believers [f] were together and had all things in common; <sup>45</sup> and they would sell their property and possessions and share them with all, to the extent that anyone had need. <sup>46</sup> Day by day continuing with one mind in the temple, and breaking bread [g] from house to house, they were taking their [h] meals together with gladness and [i] sincerity of heart, <sup>47</sup> praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to [i] their number day by day those who were being saved." (NASB)

Pentecost and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit in every believer also fulfilled the Feast of Tabernacles and the Feast of Ingathering. Every believer becomes the booth and Tabernacle and hopefully remains that way.

# **Leviticus 23: 33 – 43 New King James Version**

- "33 Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, 34 "Speak to the children of Israel, saying: 'The fifteenth day of this seventh month *shall be* the Feast of Tabernacles *for* seven days to the LORD. 35 On the first day *there shall be* a holy convocation. You shall do no customary work *on it*. 36 *For* seven days you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD. On the eighth day you shall have a holy convocation, and you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD. It *is* a sacred assembly, *and* you shall do no customary work *on it*.
- <sup>37</sup> 'These *are* the feasts of the LORD which you shall proclaim *to be* holy convocations, to offer an offering made by fire to the LORD, a burnt offering and a grain offering, a sacrifice and drink offerings, everything on its day— <sup>38</sup> besides the Sabbaths of the LORD, besides your gifts, besides all your vows, and besides all your freewill offerings which you give to the LORD.
- <sup>39</sup> 'Also on the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when you have gathered in the fruit of the land, you shall keep the feast of the LORD *for* seven days; on the first day *there shall be* a sabbath-rest, and on the eighth day a sabbath-rest. <sup>40</sup> And you shall take for yourselves on the first day the <sup>[f]</sup>fruit of beautiful trees, branches of palm trees, the boughs of leafy trees, and willows of the brook; and you shall rejoice before the LORD your God for seven days. <sup>41</sup> You shall keep it as a feast to the LORD for seven days in the year. Christ meets inside of us in OUR tabernacles, because He dwells in the hearts of every Christian believer.

**Luke 17:20-22 New King James Version** 

"20 Now when He was asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, He answered them and said, "The kingdom of God does not come with observation; <sup>21</sup> nor will they say, 'See here!' or 'See there!' [a] For indeed, the kingdom of God is within you."

<sup>22</sup> Then He said to the disciples, "The days will come when you will desire to see one of the days of the Son of Man, and you will not see it." (NKJV)

Christ fulfills the Feast of Ingathering by bringing in a harvest of souls (Matthew 9: 35 – 38) Throughout His ministry He equated the harvest with those that needed salvation.

#### **Matthew 9:35-38 New King James Version (NKJV)**

"35 Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people. But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were weary and scattered, like sheep having no shepherd. Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Plentiful provides the laborers are few. Therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest." (NKJV)

Also read Matthew 13:1 - 23

### **Leviticus 23: 23 – 25 New King James Version**

"23 Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, 24 "Speak to the children of Israel, saying: 'In the seventh month, on the first day of the month, you shall have a sabbath-rest, a memorial of blowing of trumpets, a convocation. 25 You shall do no customary work on it; and you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD.' "" (NKJV)

#### Christ IS the trumpet for the Feast of Trumpets (1 Thess. 4:16 & Rev.1:10 – 19),

#### 1 Thessalonians 4:16 New King James Version (NKJV)

"16 For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first." (NKJV)

#### **Revelation 1:10-19 New King James Version (NKJV)**

"10 I was in the Spirit on the Lord's Day, and I heard behind me a loud voice, as of a trumpet, "11 saying, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last," and, [a] "What you see, write in a book and send it to the seven churches which are in Asia: [b] to Ephesus, to Smyrna, to Pergamos, to Thyatira, to Sardis, to Philadelphia, and to Laodicea."

<sup>12</sup> Then I turned to see the voice that spoke with me. And having turned I saw seven golden lampstands, <sup>13</sup> and in the midst of the seven lampstands *One* like the Son of Man, clothed with a garment down to the feet and girded about the chest with a golden band. <sup>14</sup> His head and hair *were* white like wool, as white as snow, and His eyes like a flame of fire; <sup>15</sup> His feet *were* like fine brass, as if refined in a furnace, and His voice as the sound of many waters; <sup>16</sup> He had in His right hand seven stars, out of His mouth went a sharp two-edged sword, and His countenance *was like* the sun shining in its strength. <sup>17</sup> And when I saw Him, I fell at His feet as dead. But He laid His right hand on me, saying to me, <sup>[c]</sup> "Do not be afraid; I am the First and the Last. <sup>18</sup> I *am* He who lives, and was dead, and behold, I am alive forevermore. Amen. And I have the keys of Hades and of Death. <sup>19</sup> Write <sup>[d]</sup> the things which you have seen, and the things which are, and the things which will take place after this."(NKJV)

Christ's resurrection on the day after the Old Testament Sabbath day fulfilled the rest for all of us. Without the resurrection there would be no rest. Without His resurrection, we would not be resurrected with Him in heaven when we die. CHRIST HIMSELF changed and moved the Lord's day to the first day of the week for Christians. The first day of the week runs from Saturday at dark to Sunday at dark.

#### **Matthew 11:27-29 New King James Version**

"27 All things have been delivered to Me by My Father, and no one knows the Son except the Father. Nor does anyone know the Father except the Son, and the one to whom the Son wills to reveal Him. 28 Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. 29 Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am [a]gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (NKJV)

When Christ's death, resurrection, and the baptism of the Holy Spirit were fulfilled, Christ said the kingdom would be taken away from the Jews (Matthew 21:43) and out of the Old Testament law and be given to another nation – a nation of believers in Christ in whom the kingdom of God would dwell. The Jews would also have an opportunity to JOIN that nation once they would receive Christ Jesus as the Messiah and enter into the new nation of Christians. God HAD to change the day of rest, because if He hadn't the devil would always come calling and making false accusations concerning whether you were obeying the OLD Testament law or not, because we would be making OTHERS work by heating our homes with electricity, gas, and water. It was protection.

**Matthew 21:42-44 New King James Version** 

"42 Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures:

'The stone which the builders rejected

Has become the chief cornerstone.

This was the LORD's doing,

And it is marvelous in our eyes'?

<sup>43</sup> "Therefore I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a nation bearing the fruits of it. <sup>44</sup> And whoever falls on this stone will be broken; but on whomever it falls, it will grind him to powder."" (NKJV)

#### **Matthew 5:17-18 New King James Version**

"17 "Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill. 18 For assuredly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one [a]jot or one [b]tittle will by no means pass from the law till all is fulfilled." (NKJV)

Christ <u>HAD</u> to fulfill ALL of the sacrifices required as a consequence for sinning, for the Feast Days, and for the Sabbath according to His Father's command. The Old Testament law was not completely fulfilled until Christ's crucifixion, entombment, Resurrection on the first day of the week, and also when the Holy Spirit came on the day of Pentecost on the first day of the week. Christ also gave us the Communion meal which was not only a way of remembering His sacrifice for us, but it also brings healing and deliverance for our souls.

Christ CHANGED the law and the Commandments, because of...

2 Corinthians 3:7-8 New International Version

"7 Now if the ministry that brought death, which was engraved in letters on stone, came with glory, so that the Israelites could not look steadily at the face of Moses because of its glory, transitory though it was, 8 will not the ministry of the Spirit be even more glorious?" (NIV)

The word "transitory" in verse 7, means temporary. (NIV)

In God's word in the Old Testament, the word "perpetual" (KJV) and the words "throughout your generations" (KJV) occur numerous times, but the original intent was NOT that ALL of the rules for offering sacrifices would be followed forever, instead they would be followed until the fullness of time when the Lord Jesus Christ came to fulfill the Old Testament law and created a NEW TESTAMENT LAW and BETTER COVENANT! When Christ gave us the communion meal and told us to DO IT IN REMEMBRANCE OF HIM (Luke 22:19, 1 Corinthians 11: 24-25) (which would mean perpetually) it took the place of all of the Old Testament Feasts. Some of Christ's Commandments DO come from the Old Testament, some were changed, and some are more stringent.

If you don't know about the one true living God – Father God, the Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit you're probably wondering - why did mankind NEED a Savior in the first place?

In the Bible, in the Old Testament Book of Genesis, when Adam and Eve disobeyed and sinned against God - when they ate from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the garden of Eden - sin entered into the world, and God DID NOT want that to happen. Adam and Eve's sin brought spiritual death to all mankind because Adam and Eve's sin DESTROYED God's original intent for what mankind was supposed to be exposed to. God didn't want them to have any knowledge of evil. All humankind was separated from God as a result of Adam and Eve's actions.

Through Adam and Eve's sin – the whole world would know BOTH good and evil. There ARE 2 spiritual worlds – Good and Evil. The GOOD spiritual world is led by God – Father God, Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. The EVIL spiritual world is led by Satan and the "principalities", the "powers," the "rulers of the darkness of this age," and "spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places." (Ephesians 6:12 NKJV) They ARE NOT more powerful than GOD. In the Old Testament, the loss of material possessions was supposed to act as a deterrent to sin, but the leaders let things slide or would show favoritism and made exceptions for particular people. A good example is the woman caught in the act of adultery. (John 8:2 - 11) She was going to be killed (as she should have been under Old Testament law). The Old Testament required that both the woman and the man be put to death, but the scribes and Pharisees only brought the woman forward which was not equitable or fair. Christ knew this and He let her go based on her conviction of sin and repentant heart. When the OLD way wasn't working, God had to create a NEW way - a way that would be fair. God ALWAYS had a plan to redeem the lives of ALL mankind – that plan was Christ. (Gen. 3:1 – 24)

In the New Testament when you sin, (whether you are a believer or not) you are following the wrong entity. You are following Satan. When you sin, a demon, devil, or unclean spirit enters your physical body without your even knowing it. They cause sickness, disease, confusion, torment, and can wreak havoc in your life!

This is a consequence for sinful behaviors and this consequence is consistently applied throughout ALL HUMANKIND. God did this so everything WAS FAIR concerning wrongdoing and also to draw ALL HUMANKIND TO HIM, BECAUSE WE ALL NEED GOD'S HELP TO LEAD A SIN FREE LIFE. A decision to follow Christ requires repentance and renouncing (meaning choosing to reject Satan and rejecting all evil in your life). It indicates a desire to be free from evil and to choose goodness instead – a desire to be a NEW CREATION! When you invite Christ to come into your heart and life, HE DWELLS INSIDE YOUR PHYSICAL BODY TO HELP YOU IN EVERYTHING YOU DO! It doesn't mean that believers in Christ haven't made mistakes, but it does mean they want to TRY to be sin free. Once a person comes to Christ, he or she has ALL AUTHORITY OVER EVIL FORCES!

**Romans 6:23 New American Standard Bible** 

<sup>"23</sup> For the wages of sin is death, but the gracious gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (NASB)

Luke 10:19 New King James Version

"19 Behold, I give you the authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you." (NKJV)

Now when we sin, we have to confess our sin one to another to be healed:

#### James 5:14-16 New American Standard Bible

"14 Is anyone among you sick? *Then* he must call for the elders of the church and they are to pray over him, [a] anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; 15 and the prayer of faith will [b] restore the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up, and if he has committed sins, [c] they will be forgiven him. 16 Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another so that you may be healed. A [d] prayer of a righteous person, when it is [e] brought about, can accomplish much." (NASB)

#### 1 John 1:9 New King James Version

"9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (NKJV)

When you confess your sins one to another, God remembers your sins no more and He makes the demons, devils, and unclean spirits LEAVE your physical body. When they ARE removed, this is called "DELIVERANCE" from evil. Sometimes IT DOES require prayer and fasting to find out what your sins have been and to also be delivered from evil forces. A person needs to ask the Lord if a particular sin requires prayer and fasting.

#### **CAUTION!**

When you come to Christ, God CAN speak to you, but so can the devil, so you need to follow the scriptures and test the spirits to see if they are from God.

1 John 4:1-4 New American Standard Bible

"4 Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world. <sup>2</sup> By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God; <sup>3</sup> and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God; this is the *spirit* of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming, and now it is already in the world. <sup>4</sup> You are from God, little children, and have overcome them; because greater is He who is in you than he who is in the world." (NASB)

GOD WILL NEVER TELL YOU TO HURT SOMEONE ELSE OR YOURSELF! SOMETIMES HAVING EXPERIENCED SEVERE TRAUMA IN YOUR LIFE REQUIRES CHRISTIAN COUNSELING TO RECEIVE COMPLETE DELIVERANCE!

Since Christ forgave PETER, He can forgive you too. Just listen to THIS prayer. It is written with the pronoun "we" so that when YOU say "Amen" out loud at the end - then we will have come into agreement with your prayer, and you will have accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as your LORD and Savior.
