FACTS

Largest elephant - about 10 – 13 ft high at the shoulders

Weighs up to about 9 tons

Large ears that are used to lower body heat

A slightly rounded forehead with no additional bump

A back that dips slightly in the middle

Males and Females can have tusks

2 finger-like lobes on the end of their trunk used to pinch items to pick things up



African Forest Elephant (Loxodonta Cyclotis)

FACTS

About 8 feet tall

Weighing about 4 tons

Darker color

Ears that are more round that are used to lower body heat

Males and Females can have tusks that are usually slightly pink, orange or darker in color

2 finger-like lobes on the end of their trunk used to pinch items to pick things up

DNA tests have proven that it is distinctly different from the African Savannah Elephant

FACTS

About 11 1/2 feet tall at the shoulder

Weight is about 6 tons

Smaller head size

Small ears that are used to lower body heat

Forehead has 2 bumps

Slightly arched back

Single lobe at the end of its trunk used to curl it around an object

Males and females can have tusks

3 subspecies:

- Indian (Elephas maximus indicus)
- Sumatran (Elephas maximus sumatranus)
- Sri Lankan (Elephas maximus maximus)
