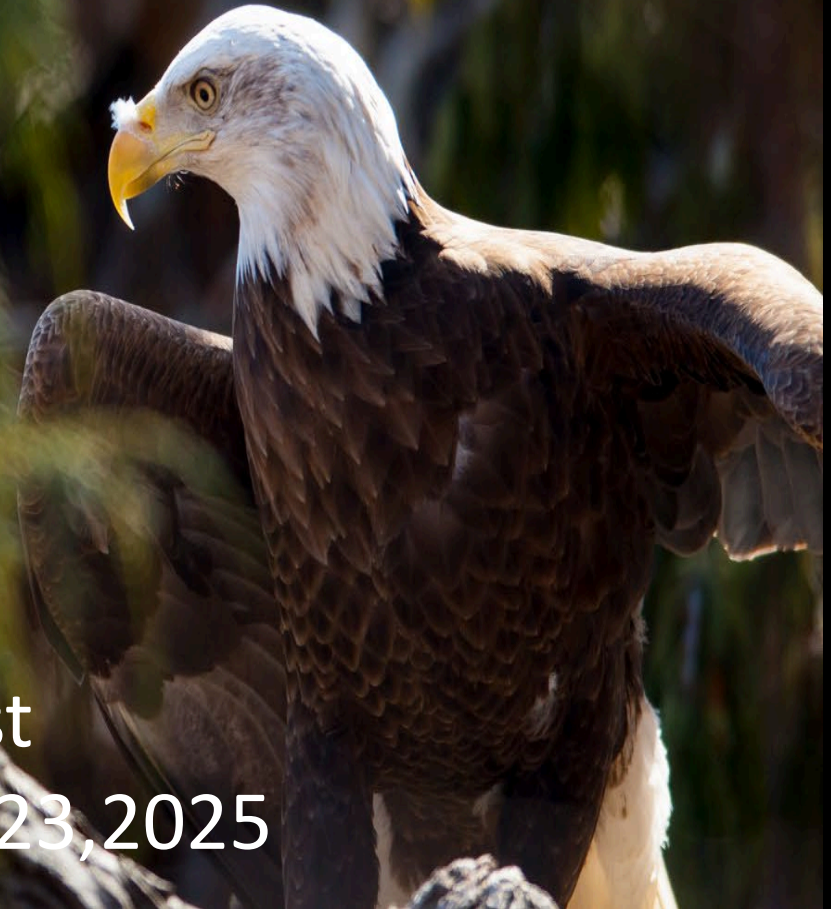


LESSONS TO LEARN FROM THE AMERICAN BALD EAGLE

Psalm 115:1

Since 1782, the American Bald Eagle has been the National Bird of the United States of America. The view of it soaring and gliding above the Earth is so appropriate to represent our freedoms that we have here and that we hold so dear. Its dark brown and deep gold plumage show up so beautifully against the blue sky as it catches a wind current. They watch from a high perch and then swoop down to catch their prey. This Eagle has caught a fish with its sharp talons.



God made it a majestic bird – it doesn't require any embellishment with its white feathered head and its sharp yellow-orange beak. As a predator, American Bald Eagles are at the top of the food chain. If they are young, sick, or injured they may become prey to other animals. Their only REAL enemies have been mankind, and the poisonous chemicals that mankind has produced.



American Bald Eagles love to eat fish like: carp, herring, salmon, and catfish.

They will also eat other birds like: ducks, anklets, coots, and others.

They eat mammals like: muskrats, jackrabbits, and more.

Sometimes even crabs, shellfish, turtles, snakes, and other land and sea creatures are on the menu.

When dead animals are available they will feed on those as well.



American Bald Eagles mate for life unless their partner dies. They build a strong large nest in trees about 180 feet high above the ground, on cliffs, and even on the ground on islands. The nests are built by both the male and female and are made of sticks and are lined with smaller materials. They may be added to and used year after year. Males and females mate at about 4 – 5 years of age. The female lays about 1 – 3 eggs.



Both parents take turns sitting on the nest. One keeps watch while the other searches for food. The incubation period for their eggs is about 34 – 36 days. For about the first 2 weeks after hatching - one parent always stays behind. Then, BOTH parents begin taking turns searching for prey, bringing it to the nest, and tearing the food, so that the Eaglets can eat it. In this picture you can see one of the parents returning to the nest to feed the Eaglets. After about 3 to 6 weeks, the Eaglets can begin pecking at the food themselves.



You can see in the picture how one parent stayed behind to stand guard over the Eaglets. Young American Bald Eagles acquire their feathers at approximately 10 to 12 weeks that will allow them to take their first flight. Young Eagles have both dark colored beaks and feathers until they approach breeding age when they acquire their white heads and bright yellow-orange beaks at about 4 to 5 years of age.

The loyalty of one mate for another, the dedication they show in working together to build a strong, safe home, their attentiveness that they show to their young – to provide protection, care, and provision, the joint work ethic Eaglets learn by watching their parents in and out of the nest regarding how to best survive - are ALL things that ALL mankind should emulate. They are FINE examples of why choosing the American Bald Eagle as a symbol of America was what GOD intended it to be, so that we could ALL soar like Eagles!
