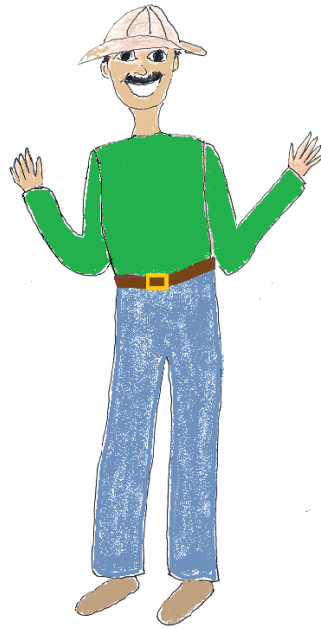

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT CONESTOGA WAGONS AND PRAIRIE SCHOONERS

An animal pulled wagon, called a Conestoga wagon, was primarily used by people who lived during the 18th century (1701 to 1800) It could hold up to about 12,000 pounds. The base of the wagon curved up at both ends so that the cargo wouldn't move inside. It was longer than a "prairie schooner" and required more animals to pull it. It was used primarily in the Eastern U.S. to haul freight. The white canvas cover protected the cargo from foul weather.

The wagon that was invented after the Conestoga wagon and used mostly in the 19th century (1801 to 1900) was called a "Prairie Schooner." The pioneers used this type of wagon to move their possessions out west. It was smaller, had a flat bottom, and lower sides than the Conestoga wagon. It was lighter, it was easier to make a turn in it and required fewer animals to pull it. It got the name "Prairie Schooner" because in the distance the white canvas cover looked like a sailing ship.

People rarely slept in a Conestoga wagon OR a "Prairie Schooner" they were meant for cargo only. They were filled with supplies for the journey. If driven by horses or mules, the driver and possible rider sitting upfront would endure jostling and jerking making the ride VERY hard and uncomfortable. If driven by oxen, the owner would walk beside the animals guiding them with verbal commands. This was because of the rough terrain they were traveling through. Remember, these wagons did not travel on paved roads like those of today and they didn't have rubber tires. They traveled on unprepared ground, the ride was rocky, and it was often the first time a wagon had even ridden on the land. During this time in history, people slept in tents outside under the stars rather than in a Covered Wagon or "Prairie Schooner," because they were never meant for sleeping in the first place. The open floor area was very narrow.

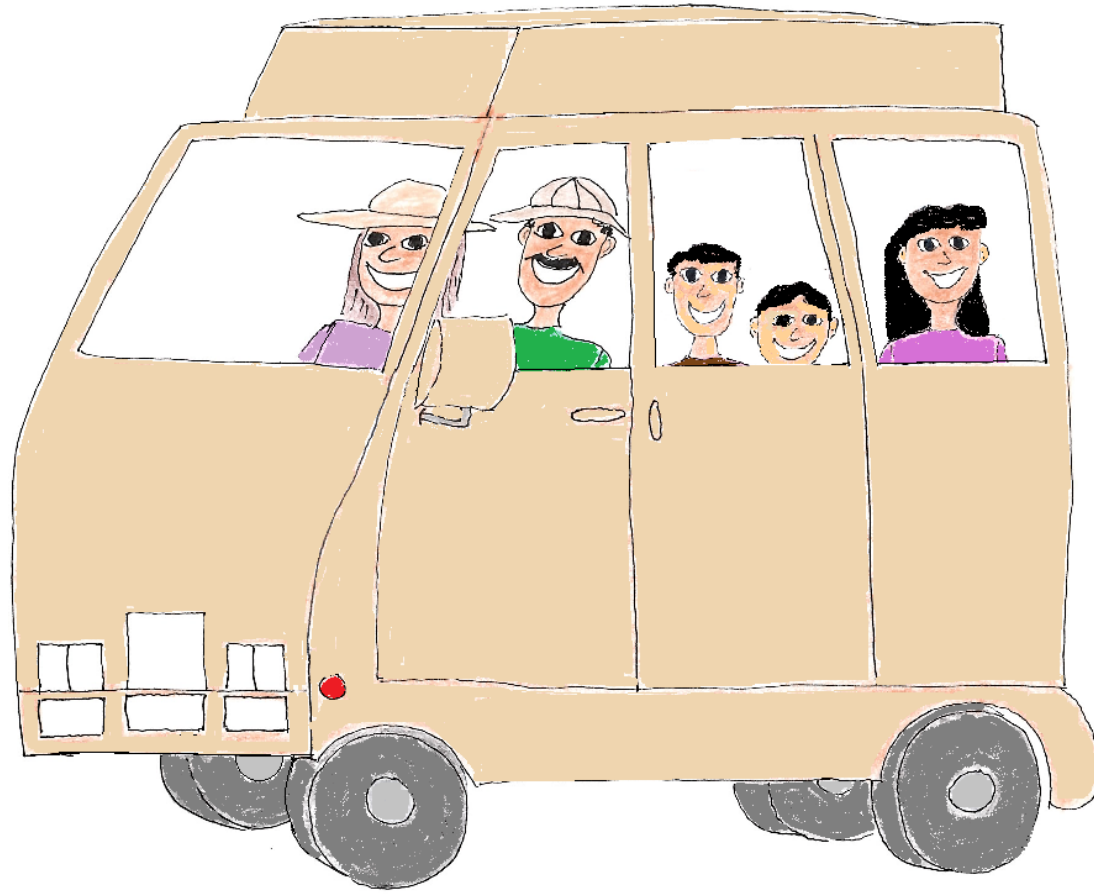

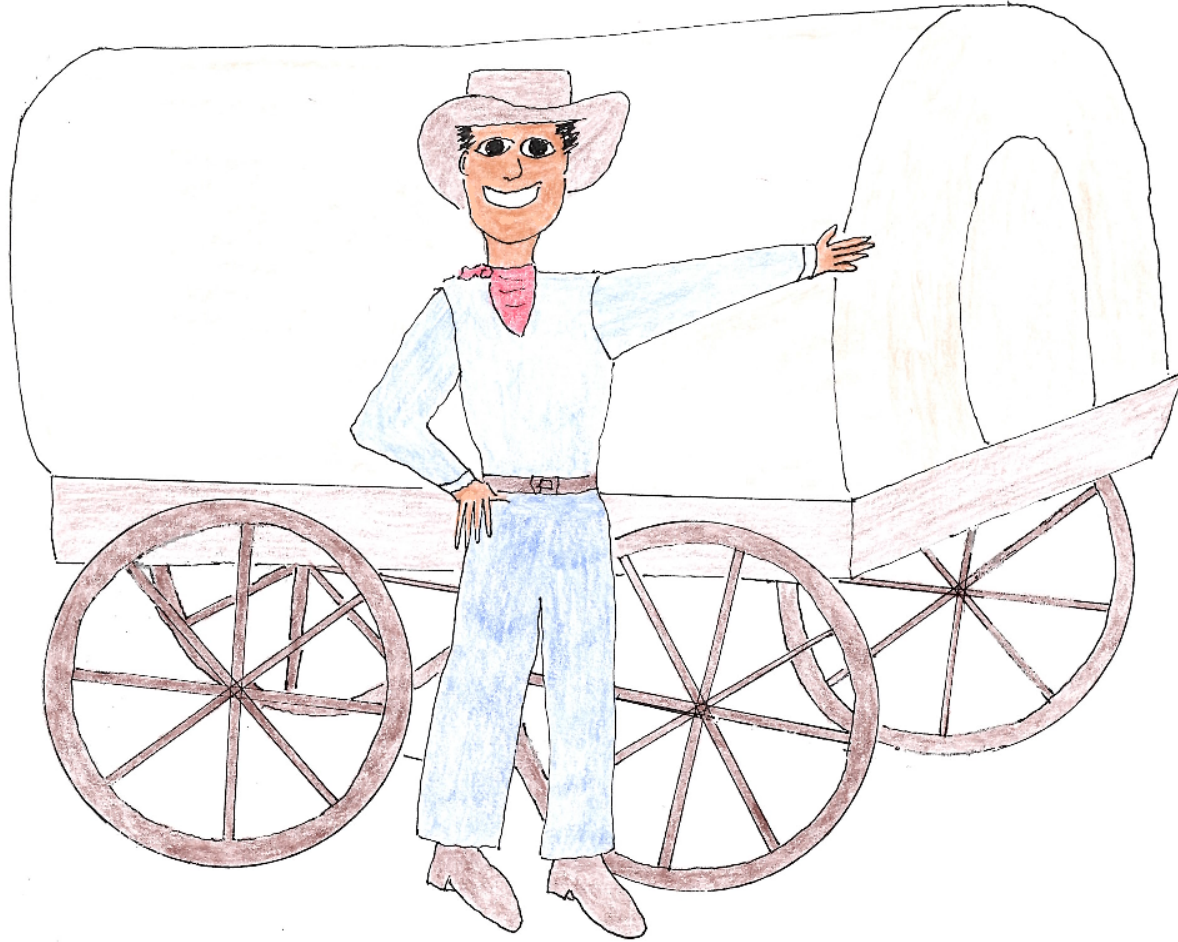

They packed up the van...



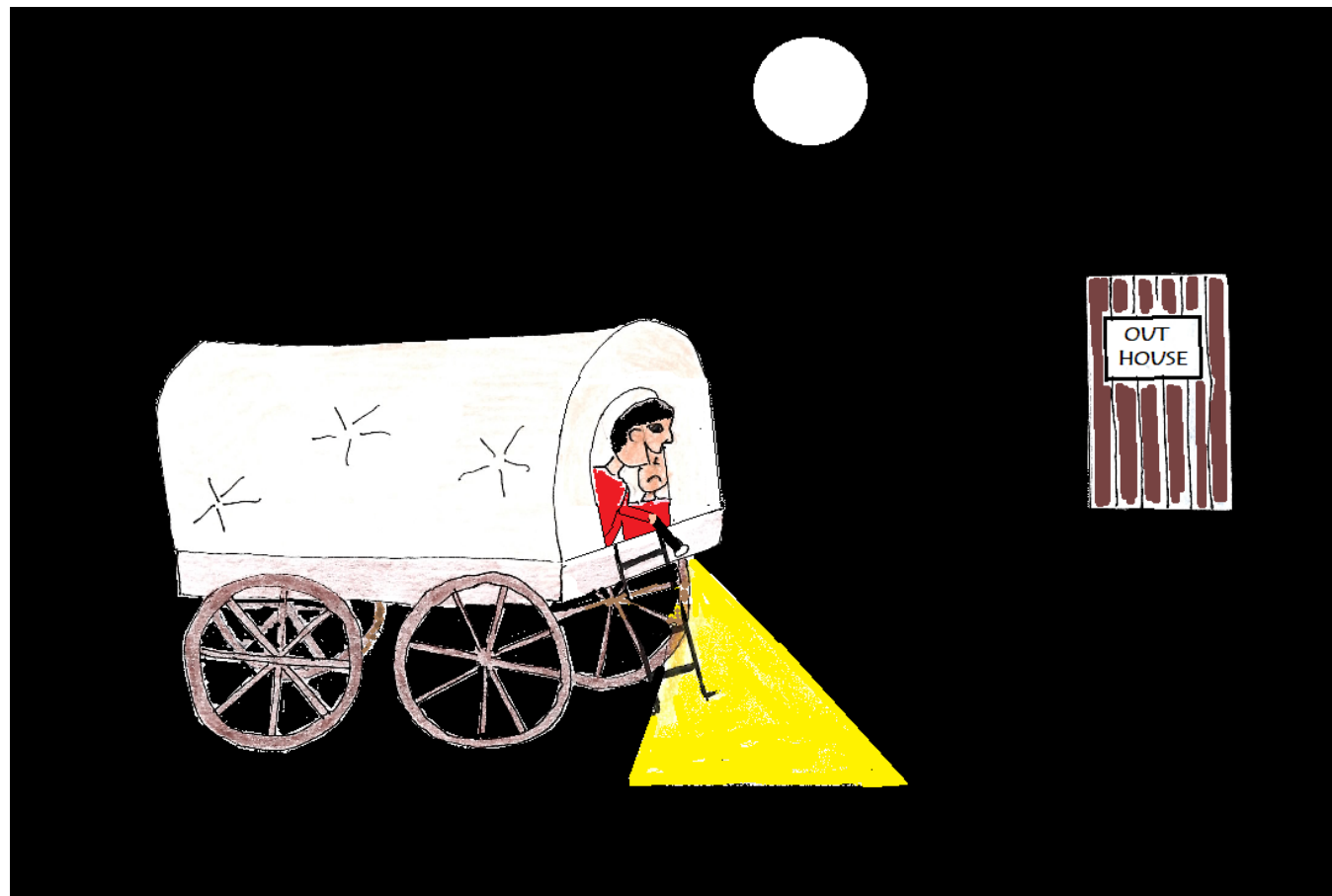

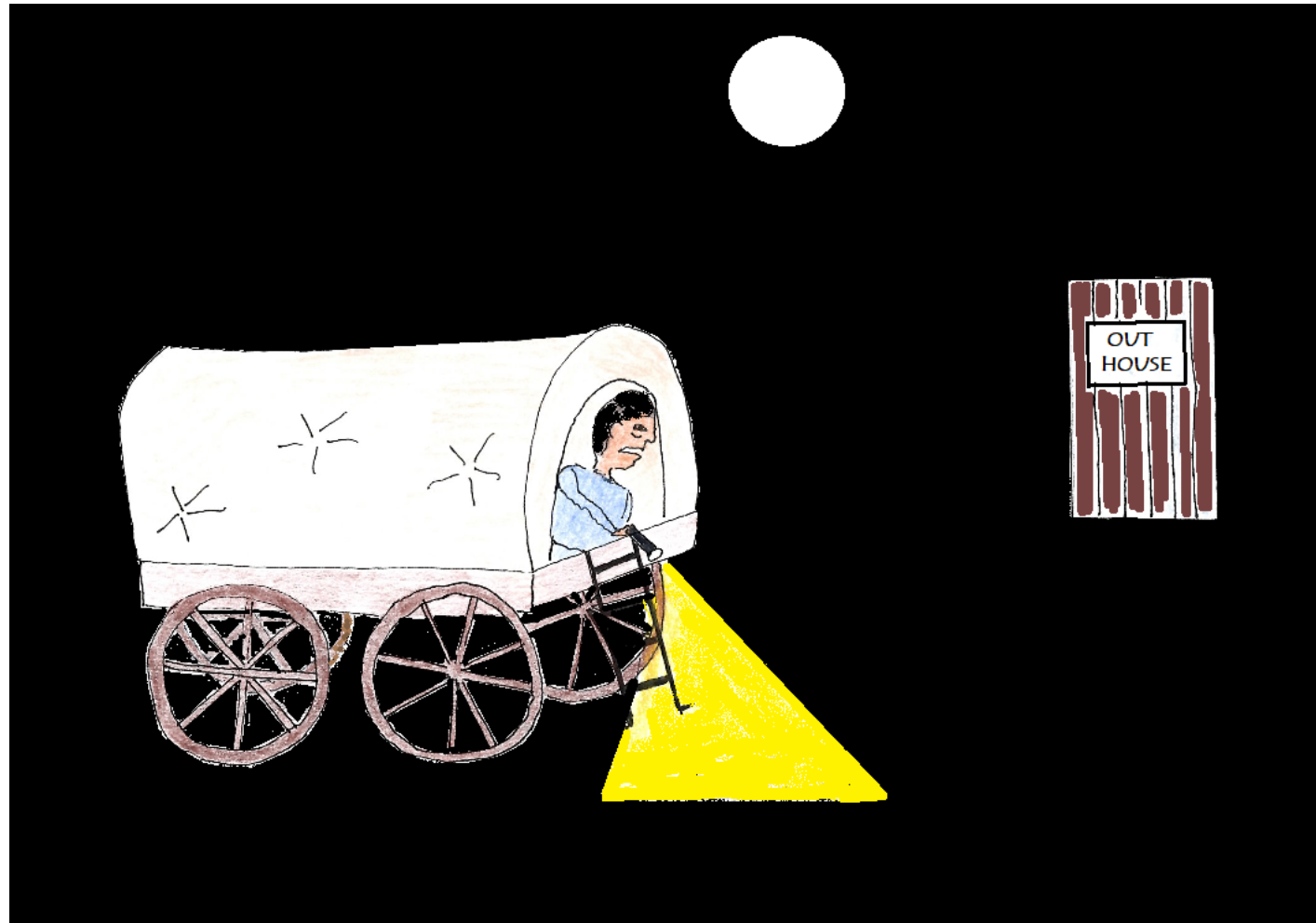
They made pan burgers on the fire

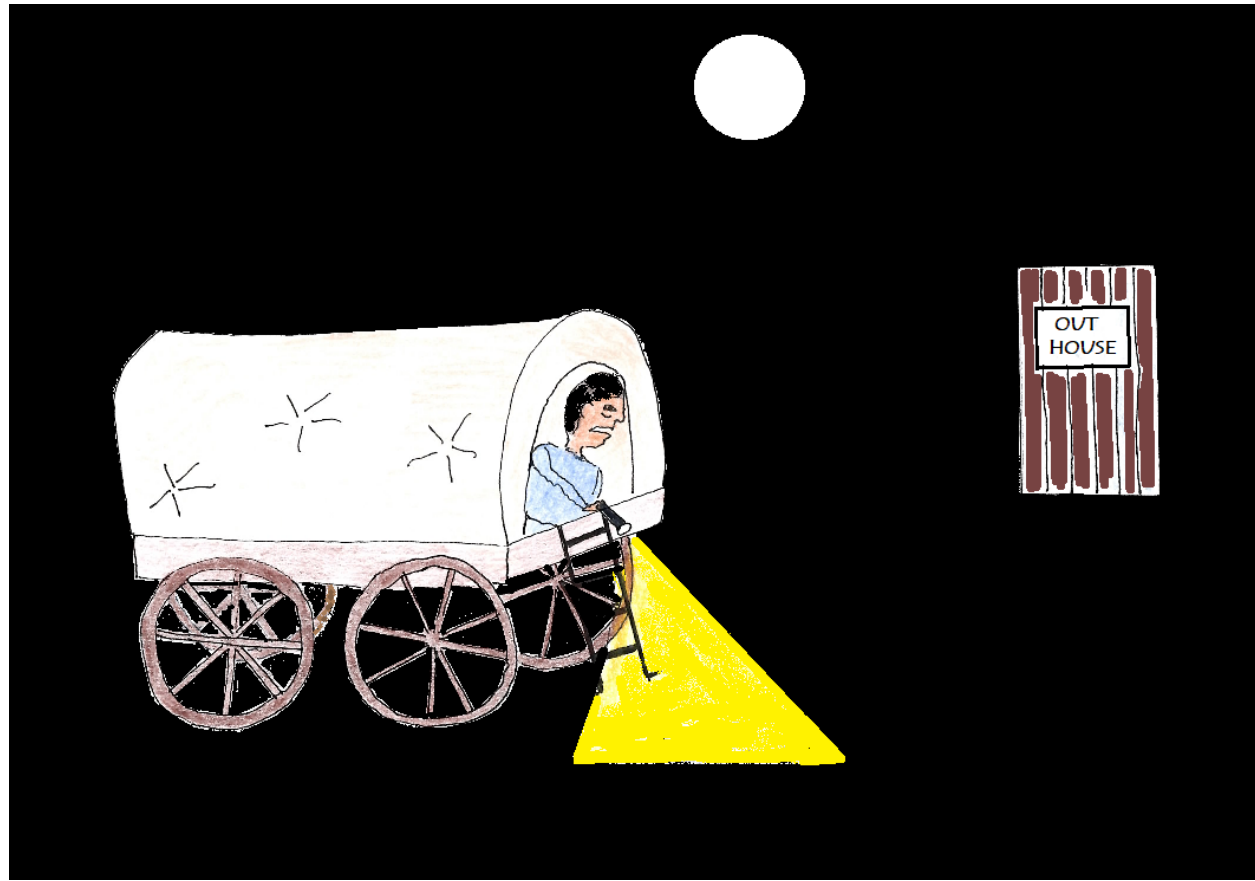
...cooked baked beans in a can.



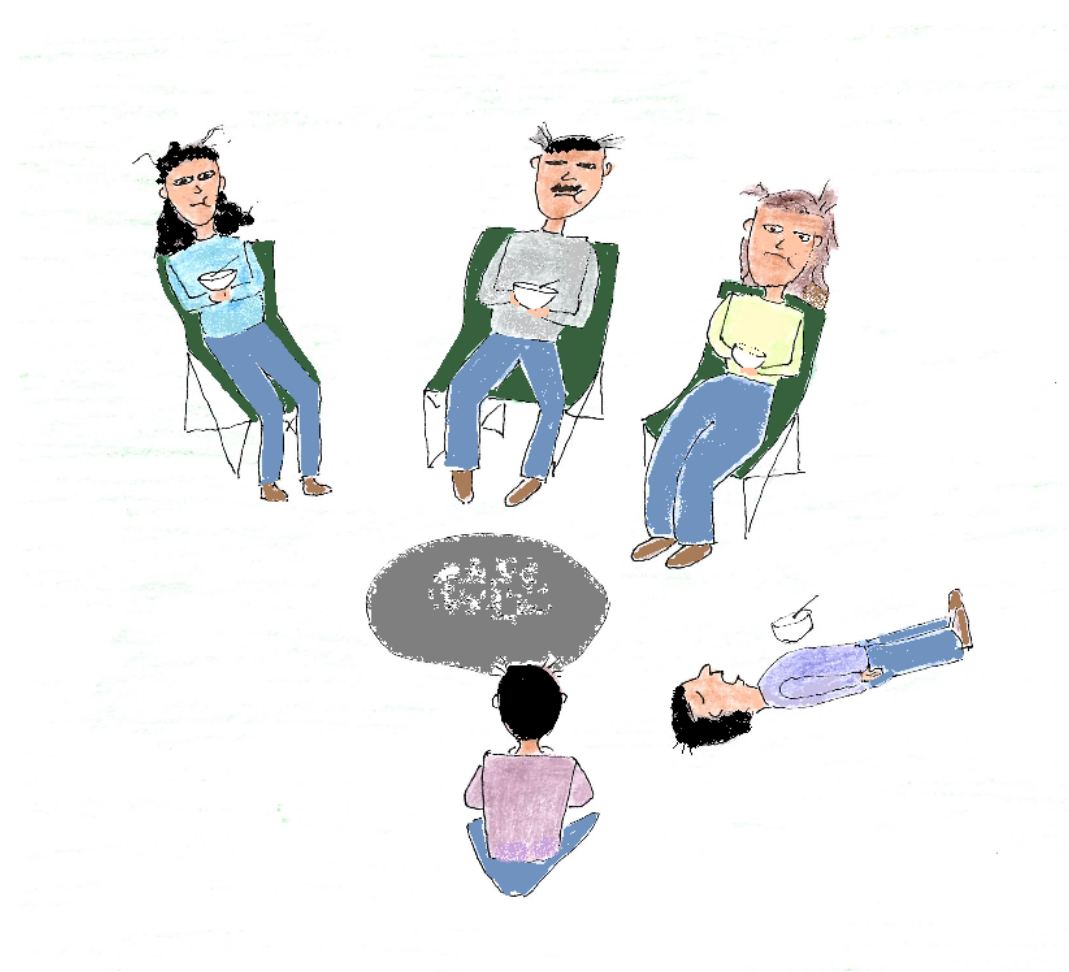
