When you look up a word in a dictionary, you will find many words. You will **ALSO**

find that even **ONE** word can be a member of several different Parts of Speech depending on how it is used in a sentence. As you read this book, you may find words listed as one form of speech and it also may be listed as another Part of Speech too.

This **IS NOT** an error. I could not give all of the possible definitions for every word or this book would be hundreds of pages long.

Please consult a dictionary if needed.

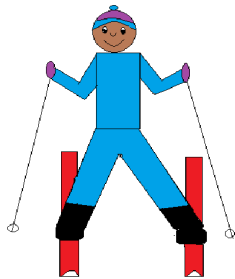
Verbs are words that show an action, an event, or a means of being.

For example:

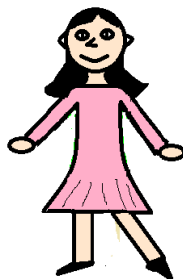
- run



- ski



- dance



- love "Zinnias love sunlight."

Stative Verbs show a means of being. For example:

love, like, adore, appreciate, hate, despise, loathe, annoy, confuse, baffle, disappoint, frighten, please, feel, believe, think, understand, doubt, agree, disagree, need, want, prefer, appear, see, hear, taste, sense, seem, shocked, look, contain, surprised, excite, interested, motivated, know, consist, involve, see, hear, smell, taste, touch, to name a few.

God's word says,

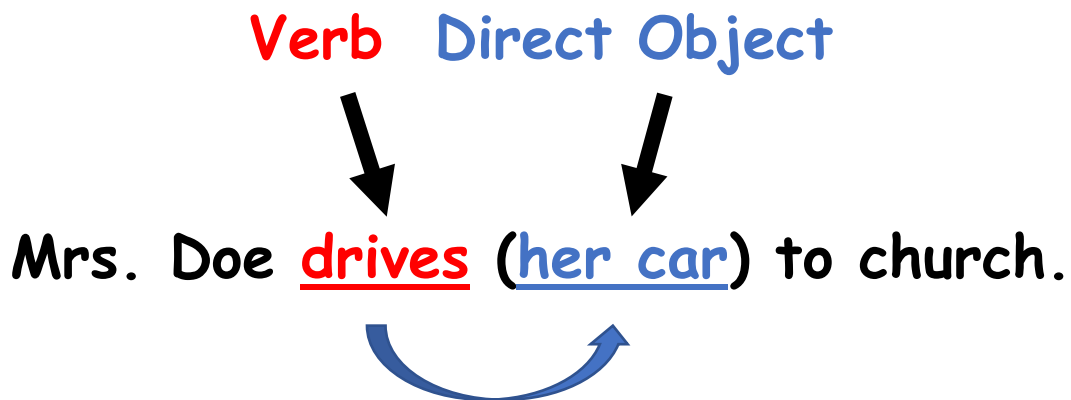
Galatians 5:19-21 New International Version

**"¹⁹ The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; ²⁰ idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions ²¹ and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God."
(NIV)**

There are 2 kinds of Action Verbs:

1. **A Transitive Verb** is a verb that appears BEFORE a noun, pronoun, or noun phrase that is RECEIVING THE ACTION. This means the action (verb) is TRANSFERRED to the noun that follows it.

For example:



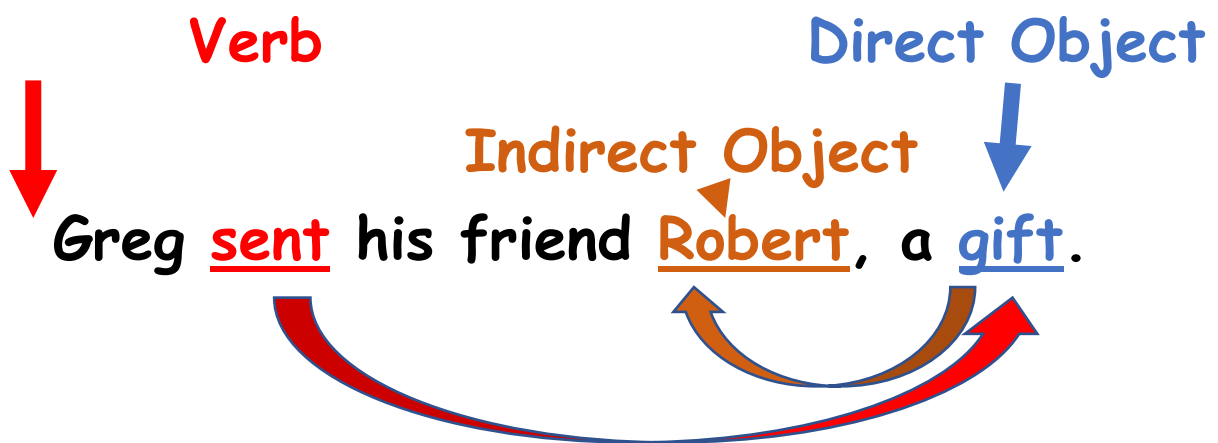
There is a relationship between the **verb** action - "drives" and what she is driving - "her car."

This answers the question:

What does Mrs. Doe drive?

The answer: Her car.

1A. A **Transitive Verb** forms a relationship between the Verb and the Direct Object FIRST and THEN transfers it to an Indirect Object.



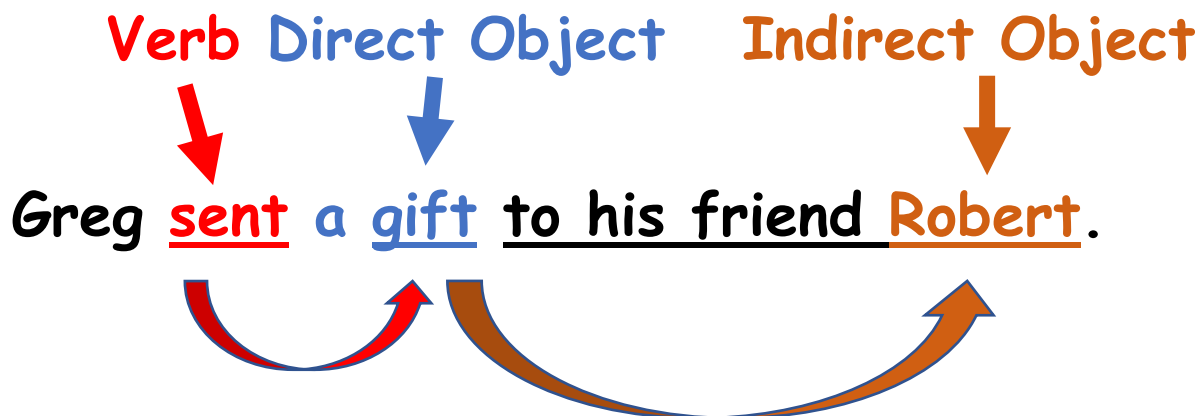
What was the first relationship formed?

The Verb "sent" and the Noun "gift" - the **Direct Object**.

What was the second relationship?

The Noun "gift" and the person it was sent to
Robert - the **Indirect Object**.

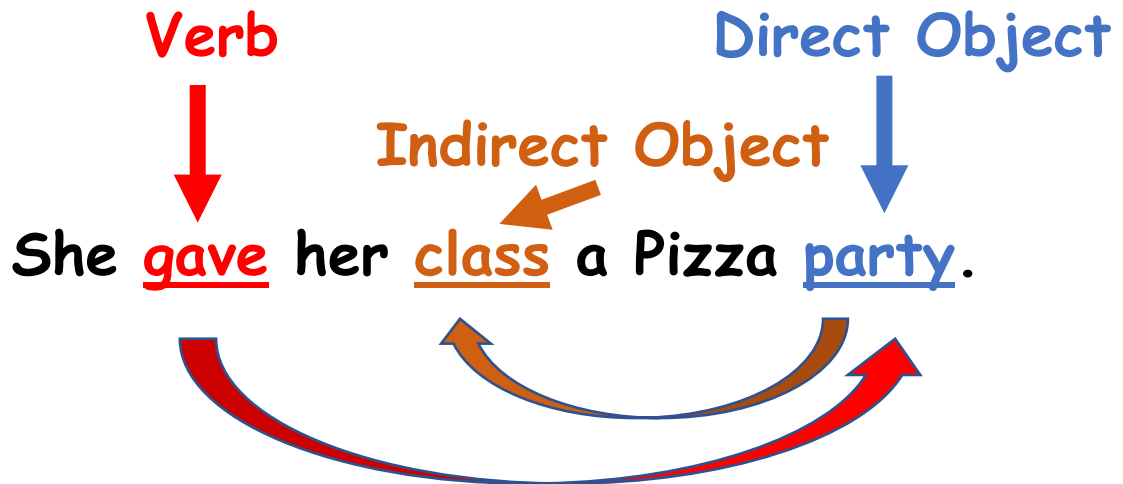
It can be written in another way using a Prepositional Phrase.



Let's do another one of those and I'll show you again how a prepositional phrase works too!

Remember, a **Transitive Verb** forms a relationship between the Verb and the Direct Object first and THEN TRANSFERS it to an Indirect Object.

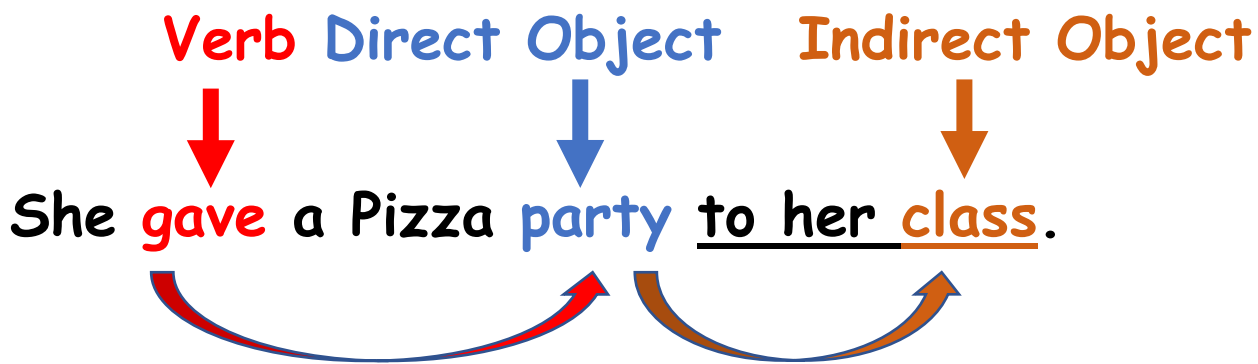
What was the first relationship formed?

The **Verb** "gave" and the Noun "party" - the **Direct Object**.

What was the second relationship?

The Noun "party" and the people it was given to - her "class" - the **Indirect Object**.

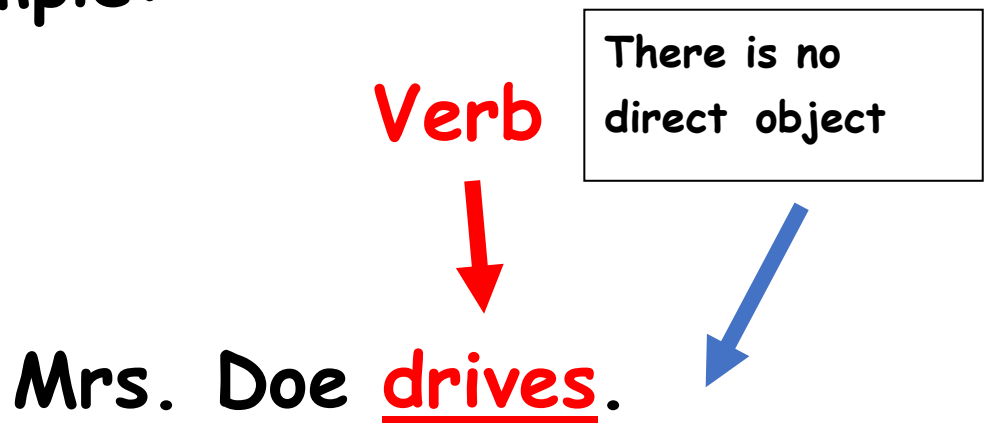
Again, another way of saying this is by using a Prepositional Phrase.



We'll talk more about Prepositional Phrases in another lesson!

2. **Intransitive** means the verb has no noun following it to refer to - there IS no direct object.

For example:



Do we know what Mrs. Doe drives?

Answer: No.

There are also **Auxiliary Verbs** or Helping Verbs. These are Verbs that WORK WITH the MAIN Verbs. Some **Helping Verbs** for example are: am, are, be, can, could, did, do, does, has, had, have, is, was, were, will, shall, would, must, may, might, been, being, and should - to name a few. They help to increase interest and meaning by adding details and timing, to the MAIN VERB within a sentence.

Examples:

Helping Verb Regular Verb

I am working hard on lessons.

Helping Verb Regular Verb

Sam is sleeping, because he is working the night shift.

There are also **Linking Verbs** like: am, are, be, been, being, become/s, feels, appears, is, seem/s, was, were, has been, would have been, have been, should have been, will have been, could have been, will be, can be, could be, shall have been, has been, shall be, should be, and have become - to name a few. These are NOT action verbs. They create a link between the subject or an adjective describing the subject (nouns, pronouns, or adjectives).

For example:

He is a veterinarian.

In the sentence above, there is a link made between the Pronoun "He" and the noun "Veterinarian."

The new doctor and his wife seem like nice people.

In the sentence above, there is a link made between the doctor and his wife and the adjective and noun "nice people."

I have become tired of people making excuses for using foul language.

In the sentence above, there is a link made between the noun "I" and the adjective "tired."

When you think of Verbs and Verb Tenses you've got to think of your OWN life as a timeline. God's word says,
James 1: 19 - 26 (NIV)

¹⁹ My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, ²⁰ because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. ²¹ Therefore, get rid of all moral

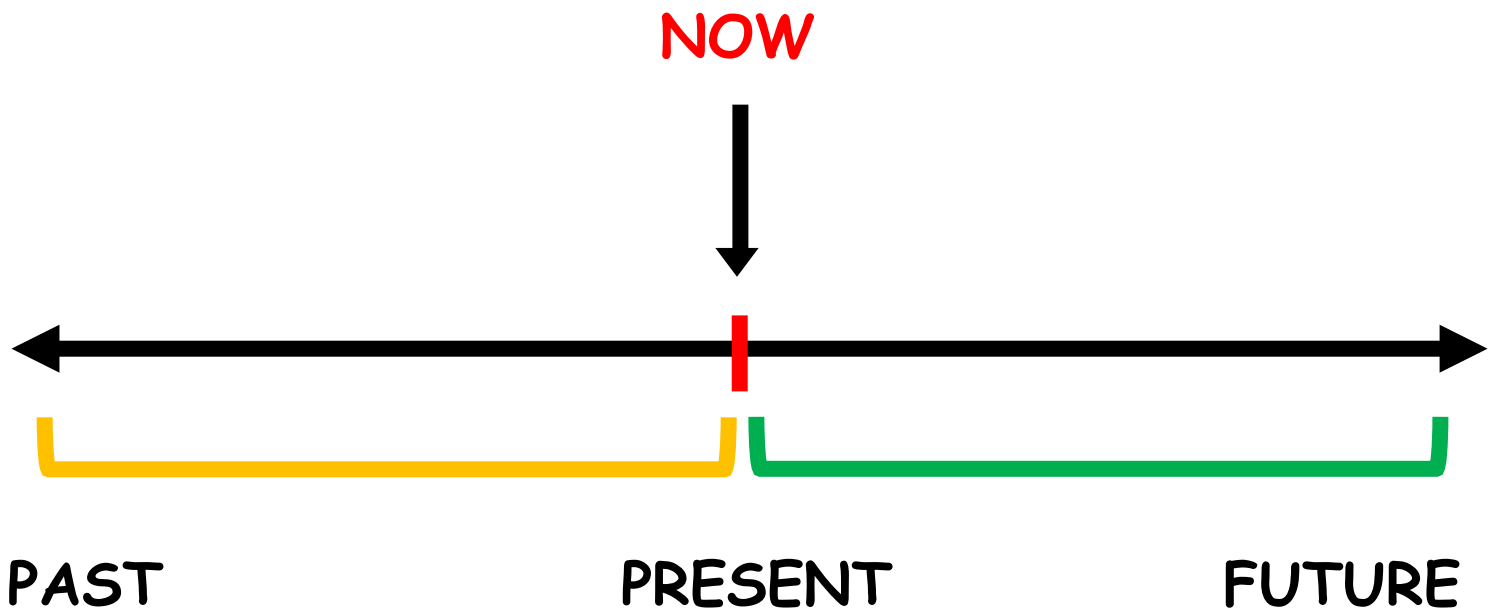
filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you.

²² Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. ²³ Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴ and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. ²⁵ But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.

²⁶ Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless. ²⁷ Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.”
(NIV)

The word “DO” is a Verb. It's an ACTION WORD! The Lord said in the highlighted areas of that scripture we are supposed to be DOERS of the words of God.

You've got a PAST, a PRESENT, and a FUTURE.



You can't change your PAST, but YOU CAN CHANGE YOUR PRESENT AND YOUR FUTURE!

You've got to think about THIS day and what you are doing NOW as if it were the LAST day of the rest of your life! What would you want people to write in your death notice?
